## **IIHMR University**

IIHMR is the first of its kind knowledge institution in India, established in 1984 in Jaipur, with attention solely focused on health systems management. The Institute of Health Management Research was established as IIHMR University vide Act No.3 of 2014 of the Government of Rajasthan. Hereinafter, the organisation will be addressed as IIHMR University. IIHMR University has been accorded approval by the UGC vide their letter number F. No. 8-21/2014 (CPP-I/PU) dated October 15, 2015.

IIHMR University undertakes education, training, research and consultancy in hospital management, health management, pharmaceutical management, rural management and related areas.

The University's campus is spread over an area of 14.37 acres with a lush green cover, characterized by stunning architecture. The serene ambience inspires students to strive for excellence. ### **Dr. D. A. Henderson Library and Documentation Center**

Dr. D.A. Henderson Library and Documentation Center at IIHMR University has a huge collection of books, journals, and other materials. The library's acquisition, cataloguing, circulation and serial control are digitized under Libsys Software with WebOPAC. The library also houses Udai Pareek HRD Resource Center.

IIHMR University Library and Documentation Center was dedicated to Dr. D. A. Henderson on May 31, 1996 by His Excellency Frank Wisner, US Ambassador to India. Dr. Henderson is known for his outstanding contribution to the eradication of small pox.

## **IT Center**

The IT Center at IIHMR University is a state-of-the-art center equipped with ultra-modern technology and skilled manpower to manage it. The Center offers IT related support to the students, faculty and research scholars at IIHMR University. This includes hands on technology infrastructure support (networking), managing desktops, laptops, printers, projectors and video conferencing equipment and providing data protection (backups and security) services.

# MBA PROGRAMS

## **MBA Hospital and Health Management**

### ***(Institute of Health Management Research)***

This is the university's flagship educational program which aims to develop trained professional managers with requisite skills in planning, implementation, operational management, diagnosis and problem solving, consultancy, and entrepreneurship. Through this rigorous program, graduates are able to manage hospitals and healthcare institutions globally, both in the public and the private sectors, thus meeting the demand for quality healthcare management. The intake capacity for the course is 180.

The University builds achievers through the program. Our students have brought laurels in many inter-campus and national competitions in academic and non-academic activities. They have presented papers in conferences organized by the University, other institutions and have published their papers and won prestigious international scholarships. The University also encourages students to take up entrepreneurship. For this purpose, an Incubation Centre has been established at the university.

### **Objectives of the Program**

The broad objective of the program is to build knowledge and skills to facilitate high performance as effective professionals in health and hospital systems, both in the public and private sectors. The syllabus and course content are designed keeping in mind the current requirements of the healthcare industry. The objectives are as under:

- To enhance decision making and administrative competence of the students to enable them to face challenges of the healthcare industry.
- To develop skills in planning, building and managing healthcare organisations.
- To participate and contribute to the formulation of public health policies.
- To promote knowledge through applied and conceptual research relevant to management and to disseminate this knowledge through publications.
- To collaborate with other institutions in India and abroad for furtherance of professional exposure.
- Management education and assisting in institution building in a meaningful manner.

### **Programme Outcome**

- To help understand the latest concepts and techniques of management and their application in making the managerial roles of the participants efficient and effective.

- To develop skills of analyzing, diagnosing and solving operational problems in the delivery of healthcare and hospital services.
- To help learn about appropriate strategies for effective planning, implementation and evaluation of institutional and community based health and family welfare program.
- To help learn the application of qualitative and quantitative analytical tools as applicable to health and hospital management related problems.
- To help understand and appreciate methodologies of health/hospital management training and develop skills with focus on strategic responsibility for training and human resource development for health care delivery.
- To enlarge the outlook and vision of participants about the larger background and context of health care and health management in their historical, sociological and cultural framework.
- To help them to learn to promote the efficient and equitable allocation of resources and development of strategies to promote public health and cost-effective healthcare.
- To understand application of scientific approach to reduce cost of care through better material and money management.

Each student works with an organisation, on a project for a period of a minimum of eight weeks at the end of the first year. The objective is to allow students an intense day-to-day interaction with organisations. Summer Training provides exposure to the student to the working of an organisation in the real time. It also helps students to develop managerial skills, competencies and facilitate an informed

career choice by the students. At the end of summer training, they will be assessed based on their performance during the period by way of report and poster presentation.

## **SECOND YEAR**

In the second year, the students are required to opt for Hospital or Health Management. The stream is allotted before the summer training on the basis of merit in the first year, aptitude and individual preference.

#### **Dissertation and Internship**

Each student is required to submit a dissertation involving personal research in his/her area of interest. The dissertation includes a critical review of literature pertaining to the specific area of interest, data collection and analysis on the selected problem. The dissertation must be completed in the second year to qualify for the degree.



## General Instructions

### Admission Requirements

Admission to the programs will be done from among the eligible applicants based on the under mentioned eligibility criteria and selection process.

### Eligibility Criteria for MBA Hospital and Health Management

- Any recognized bachelor's degree of minimum three-year duration with at least 50% marks in aggregate.
- MAT/CAT/CMAT/ATMA/XAT/GMAT/IIHMR-U MAT score.

For candidates who do not have MAT/CAT/CMAT/ATMA/XAT/GMAT scores but wish to apply for admission to MBA Hospital and Health Management, IIHMR University will conduct IIHMR-U MAT at the IIHMR University Jaipur on March 23, 2018; April 27, 2018; May 25, 2018; and June 29, 2018. GD/PI for qualified candidates will be conducted on the same day.

Candidates appearing in the final year examination of the bachelor's degree program or awaiting results of their final year examination in 2018 may also apply. Such candidates, if selected, will be given provisional admission. They will be required to produce evidence of their graduation within two months of the start of the session.

Working professionals with relevant work experience are encouraged to apply

### Selection Procedure

The eligible candidates will be invited for Group Discussion (GD) and Personal Interview (PI). The final selection of the candidate is based on his/her performance in the qualifying examination with proportional score in MAT /CAT/CMAT /ATMA/XAT/GMAT / IIHMR-

U MAT, the Group Discussion (GD), and Personal Interview (PI). Candidates are required to bring their original documents at the time of the interview. The candidate will be assessed on the following criteria:

# MBA Rural Management

## *School of Development Studies*

In view of the burgeoning demand for development professionals who can hit the ground running in a variety of sectors, MBA in Rural Management is committed to developing a cadre of trained professional managers who are capable of managing rural development organisations and programs, both in the public and the private sectors. The intake capacity for the program is 30.

The primary objective of the coursework is to facilitate integrative learning, so that graduates are able to walk into professional roles with ease, and play a vital role both at the operational and strategic levels in their jobs. Furthermore, the course will allow the students to specialize in domains such as Financial Inclusion, Rural Health, and Livelihood Enhancement, all of which are areas of high demand.

### **Objectives of the Program**

The Program Educational Objectives (PEOs) of the course is to facilitate integrative learning in the deepest sense of the term, so that graduates can walk into professional roles with ease and play a pivotal role both at the operational and strategic level in their jobs. Currently, students in mainstream MBA in rural management programs are largely being prepared for an “operational” engagement. For this to change, the course outline of the IIHMRU MBA (RM) strikes a balance between three things:

- Critical thinking, active engagement with multiple stakeholders, and lateral thinking that allows students to think practically and strategically.
- Foundational managerial skills associated with development praxis, ideally for all sectors (government, civil society sector, and private sector); and more specifically, those skills relevant for the specializations that the students choose.

## **Evaluation Process**

Evaluation of a student's performance is a continuous process. To be recommended for the award of the degree, students are required to achieve a prescribed standard in the total course work, including both mid-term and end-term examinations.

## **Award of Degree**

The following are the requirements for passing the examination and award of the degree.

- Attendance: Every student is expected to attend all the classes (not less than 75% in any case). No unauthorized absence from field placement is permitted (Please refer to examination policy)
- Examination: A student's performance will be judged in the mid-term and end-term examinations. Every course carries a maximum of 100 marks. The mid-term exam includes assignments, class participation and written exams, whereas the end-term includes written exams. To clear a course every student has to score a minimum of 50% marks.
- Summer Training: Summer training is an integral part of the first-year course. Every student is required to write a summer training report. The students are assessed on the basis of their performance during summer training.
- Dissertation and Internship: Every student is required to undergo internship at the end of 2nd year courses and write an internship report and dissertation separately. The students are assessed on the basis of their performance in the dissertation and internship.

## **Placement**

The University has a fully functional Placement Cell which plays an instrumental role in facilitating the careers of the students. The Placement Cell comprises of Dean, Academic and Student Affairs, as the Faculty Advisor, Deputy Registrar (Academics), and Placement Executive who acts

towards the successful arrangement of training and placements of the students. The Placement Committee comprises of the student representatives from all the streams and plays an important role in the Placement Cell. The Placement Cell facilitates the following activities:

- a) Placements for summer training in the first year;
- b) Placements for internship and dissertation in the second year; and
- c) Campus placements for the outgoing students.



## Master of Public Health

Since 2013, Johns Hopkins University's Bloomberg School of Public Health (JHSPH), Baltimore, Maryland, USA in partnership with the Institute of Health Management Research University (IIHMR) has been offering Master of Public Health (MPH) degree program in Jaipur, India, for Indian students as well as those from surrounding countries. The intake capacity of the program is 30. This prestigious program is designed with the following objectives:

- To cultivate students' health management skills so that they will be prepared to enhance the effectiveness and efficiency of public health programs and services
- To enhance the capabilities of public health professionals in countries of Global South.
- To prepare professionals for challenging careers in public health management in the public and private sectors, non-governmental organisations, as well as national and multinational organisations

### MPH Program Overview

The Master of Public Health degree program is a two-year course. The coursework includes on-campus and online classes, a capstone exercise, and a practicum experience, all totaling to 80 credits. On-campus courses will begin at IIHMR Jaipur. The Students will travel to Baltimore, Maryland, for a 2-week winter session at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, USA. The MPH program 2018-2020 will commence in **October 2018**.

The curriculum is structured to build knowledge, develop skills and provide exposure to real-world situations in public health. Courses will be taught by distinguished faculty members from JHSPH and IIHMR University who have contributed to meeting the challenges of public health and health care management nationally and internationally.

The pedagogy for each course is selected judiciously, and consistently encourages the students to learn experientially, by helping them to relate concepts and theories to authentic public health management systems. The program aims to develop students' competencies in the following core areas:

- Biostatistics
- Epidemiology
- Environmental Health Sciences
- Public Health Biology
- Health Management and Functional Management
- Social and Behavioural Sciences
- Public Policy

- Ethics

## Admissions Criteria

Interested individuals from India or surrounding low- and middle-income countries must have:

- A Bachelor degree.
- A minimum of 2 years of experience (full time) related to health besides the Bachelor's/Master's degree. (Work experience is waived for Ph.D. and M.B.B.S graduates.)
- Prior college-level mathematics courses; prior college-level biology course plus another health-related course.
- Proficiency in English through prior degree, TOEFL or IELTS.
- Demonstrated quantitative and verbal skills through GRE, MCAT, LSAT, or GMAT. (Applicants with degrees besides the Bachelor's degree may request a waiver of standardized test scores if they are other sources of quantitative abilities.)

## Application Process

Applicants seeking admission to the MPH program must go through a prescreening process, and need to be pre-approved by IIHMR University before they apply. Applicants should follow the steps given below:

## **Ph.D. Program**

IIHMR University has started offering a full-fledged Ph.D. program since 2014 added to its existing postgraduate program. Although the program builds on IIHMR university's core competencies in the domain of public health, health and hospital management, pharmaceutical management and rural development, the program is envisaged to be multidisciplinary in nature and allows potential candidates to pursue research on a wide range of topics. The areas of research for the doctoral program include, but are not strictly restricted to, public health, health and hospital management, nursing management, pharmaceutical management, population and development, health economics and finance, rural and urban health, health communication and behavioural change, information technology in the health sector, health systems, food security and nutrition, and rural development. The program is open to postgraduates and professionals in the field of management, public health and medicine, nursing, Indian System of Medicine (ISM), health economics and finance, demography, rural management/development and relevant social and behavioural science disciplines. There are 15 Seats in the Ph. D program for batch commencing in 2018. (Part time or full time). Part-time Ph. D will be allowed provided all the conditions mentioned in the extant Ph. D Regulations are met as per the UGC Regulations

### **Objectives of the Program**

The Ph.D. program broadly aims at building and strengthening research capacity in three broad thrust areas of IIHMR that include i) public health/health systems, ii) pharmaceutical management and iii) development studies. The overarching purpose of the program is to create a cadre of researchers who are well equipped with necessary skills to undertake evidence-based policy research on issues of contemporary significance related to these areas, with the larger goal of promoting sustainable human development. More specific objectives of the Ph. D program are:

Building research capacity to strengthen health, pharma, rural and in the mandated disciplines of the University developing a cadre of outstanding academics and management professionals for higher level health, pharmaceutical and development studies teaching and research in postgraduate institutions and universities, health care industry, and Government and consulting organisations.

### **The program is designed to enable the students:**

To enhance the research competency and skills of postgraduates, researchers, academicians, teachers and mid-career professionals in private and Government health sectors in policy and program management research in the health and other sectors.

### **Duration of the Program**

The minimum program duration is three years including period of registration. Registration in Ph.D. is subject to passing qualifying examination which will be based on the course work in the first year of the program. Program has four important mile stones; namely; course work with 16 credits; writing and presenting research proposal, data collection and thesis writing, presentation and submission.

The maximum period allowable to complete Ph.D. is six years. The candidate will have to re-register if s/he does not complete Ph. D in six years

## **Admission Requirement**

### **Eligibility Criteria**

Candidates for admission to the Ph D. program shall have a Master's degree or a professional degree declared equivalent to the Master's or M Phil degree by the corresponding statutory regulatory body, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade 'B' in the UGC 7-point scale (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) or an equivalent degree from a foreign educational Institution accredited by an Assessment and Accreditation Agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country for the purpose of assessing, accrediting or assuring quality and standards of educational institutions.

A relaxation of 5% of marks, from 55% to 50%, or an equivalent relaxation of grade, may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (noncreamy layer)/Differently-Able and other categories of candidates as per UGC Guidelines from time to time, or for those who had obtained their Master's degree prior to 19th September 1991. The eligibility marks of 55% (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) and the relaxation of 5% to the categories mentioned above are permissible based only on the qualifying marks without including the grace mark.

### **Admission Process**

The admission process will include three steps: screening of applications, IIHMR Research Aptitude Test (IRAT) and personal interview.

#### **IIHMR Research Aptitude Test (IRAT):**

The IIHMR University will conduct a qualifying test after screening of applications and short-listing candidates. IRAT will be a written test consisting of multiple choice questions from English language proficiency, reasoning, basic quantitative analysis and research aptitude. The Test will be conducted at IIHMR University, Jaipur on the date that will be communicated separately.

Admission to the Research Degree program shall be subject to the fulfilment of the minimum cut-off marks as prescribed from time to time by UGC. Final selection for admission shall be made on the basis of the merit of the composite score.

**Exemption for IRAT:** The following categories will be exempted from the written IRAT:

UGC CSIR qualified JRF & NET, SLET, GATE and Teacher Research Fellowship holder and have passed M Phil program in relevant subjects.

#### **Personal Interview**

Personal interview will be conducted on the day of IRAT or next day after IRAT at the IIHMR University, Jaipur. All categories of candidates will be required to appear in the PI. at the time of interview the candidates are required to discuss their research interest/area through a presentation.
