

Gender and COVID 19

Covid 19 pandemic affected women and men differently due to their different roles. In general, it is said that less women were infected. However, sex segregated data was not available in public domain. During the lockdown, menfolk were exposed during their exposure to shopkeeper while domestic role(s) of women may give the opportunity. Existing inequalities and discrimination of marginalized groups such as persons with disabilities and those in extreme poverty, was worse in multiple ways. One of the consequences of lockdown measures in the country has led to an unprecedented migration of workers and families from large urban centres to rural India. The key message was “stay home”, but there are many homeless persons, they were clueless.

The incidence of gender-based violence has dramatically increased, mainly because the 'stay at home' measures and of the increased insecurity and stress in the society.

Working women found very difficult to manage both family and work while “work from home”.

Disruptions in maternal health services have been of major concern since the COVID-19 pandemic began. There was an increase of abortion/ miscarriage.

Women health workers has served for long hours consecutively. Many of them suffered with COVID and could not see their children for significant period.

According to Amartya Sen: “Disabled people are not only the most deprived human beings in the developing world, they also are the most neglected”. It was almost true during Covid 19.

Single women consist of significant proportion and they found very difficult to manage during lockdown. People with disabilities (PWDs) are usually more susceptible to viruses like Covid-19 relative to others. “Hand-washing” and “social distancing” were normal precautions, but PWDs faced serious limitations to follow these practice frequently because of the most PWDs depend on others due to physiological constraints.

COVID-19 has posed physical as well as mental health risks to marginalized population like transgender and Hijra as well. Transgender-friendly healthcare services are nearly non-existent in our country. Healthcare providers are trained in a way to provide healthcare services irrespective with the sex assigned at birth.

Webinar on “Various Gender Issues in Present Scenario: Challenges, Solution & Resolution”


