Human resource training to implement transmission schemes for renewable power evacuation in India

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Abstract

This paper presents a detailed study of existing training practices in the electricity transmission utilities, focusing on the Rajasthan state of India. Inference from data collected using questionnaire is used to investigate existing training practices and assess future training requirements. A model is designed to assess employees' training and development requirements (TDRE). Transmission utilities can effectively utilize this model to improve the performance of their workforce involved in executing transmission schemes for evacuation of renewable power. This model can help to frame training policies for the people employed in power utilities and can be deployed explicitly to execute transmission schemes and renewable power evacuation schemes to achieve the employee's expected performance.

Introduction

The power sector has been prioritized in India's Rajasthan state, and power projects have sprouted up all over the state. Six power sector companies, namely RUVNL, RVPN, RVUNL, JVVNL, JdVVNL, and AVVNL are involved in developing, operating, and managing the power supply system in Rajasthan (<https://energy.rajasthan.a>). RUVNL performs duties of power trading. JVVNL, AVVNL, and JdVVNL perform power distribution activities in Rajasthan with jurisdiction detailed in Fig. 1 (<https://energy.rajasthan.b>). RVUNL is responsible for generating electrical power. RVPN is a STU and performs activities related to planning, construction, maintenance and operation of the transmission system rated at 132 kV, 220 kV, 400 kV, and

Compliance to Public Health Advisory amid COVID-19 Scare: The Communication Conundrum and Public Health Ethics

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Abstract

Discussion of ethics in the public health arena has primarily focused on the practices of public health doctors and professionals. The community could not get the required attention in terms of their role in compliance with the communication in the form of public health advisory in times of public health crisis. Even though public health is the societal approach to protecting and promoting health, ethics in public health have prioritised behaviours of and moral dilemmas faced by public health professionals only. Leaving out the community's responsibility makes the entire gamut of public health efforts incomplete and deficient. Amid the COVID-19 pandemic, non-compliance to the public health advisory raised an important aspect of expectation of ethical behaviour by the community and what could facilitate and hinder compliance of ethical behaviour ensuring the safety of self and others. Public health ought to consider the community as not only an important

KAP Study Towards infection Prevention & Control among Staff of Small Hospitals in Churu District of Rajasthan, India

Abstract

Background: Healthcare workers routinely interact with blood-borne microbes and different microorganisms and are at a risk of getting infection. These interactions may happen during surgeries, during clinical and nursing administrations, basic assessment or while taking care of hospital facility. Knowledge, Attitude & Practice (KAP) regarding infection prevention and control (IPC) may include hand hygiene, use of PPE, gloves, masks, face shields, use of sanitizers, bio-medical waste management for safe work environment in hospitals. With this backdrop a KAP study was conducted in small hospitals, having bed strength up to 50 beds, in Churu District of Rajasthan.

Methods: The study design is descriptive and cross-sectional and was conducted in 6 small hospitals (less than 50 beds) of Churu District. The study tool included scheduled Interview and questionnaire and was conducted in Feb. to June 2020. The sample size included 75 Healthcare Workers (doctors, nurses, and staff of hospitals). The sampling technique was multistage sampling. The percentage of correct answers were recorded. A score of less than 50% was considered poor, 50% to 70% as fair while 70% and above was considered good.

Conclusion: The information on the staff was discovered to be among reasonable and good i.e., in the range of 65-75%. The act of discarding waste material was less and was observed as 67%. It was seen that 87% of staff were hepatitis B inoculated. Regular training regarding infection prevention can increase the knowledge and standardised measure may be followed by healthcare workers and staff present in the hospitals.

Introduction

Infection prevention and control (IPC) in hospitals deals with measures adopted by healthcare personnel to prevent infections which is also an important patient safety issue. The measures adopted help to protect healthcare staff from pathogenic, contagious microbes including resistant bacteria and viruses^{1,2,3}.

Hospital infections may include blood-borne infections, lung and skin infections, which are

all serious threat to hospital staff. IPC helps in protecting hospital staff, visitors, and patients against infections. It may involve hand hygiene, hand disinfection, use of PPE (gloves, face shields, masks, goggles), sharps safety, waste disposal etc⁴.

The staff should avoid wearing wristwatches, rings, or bracelets as they increase viral or bacterial load on hands resulting into infections. Hand hygiene may be performed before handling equipment,

Are Industry 4.0 technologies enablers of lean? Evidence from manufacturing industries

Abstract

Purpose – This study aims to propose a conceptual model indicating the impact of Industry 4.0 (I4.0) technologies on lean tools. Additionally, it prioritizes I4.0 technologies for the digital transformation of lean plants.

Design/methodology/approach – The authors conducted a questionnaire-based survey to capture the perception of 115 experts of manufacturing industries from Germany, India, Taiwan and China. The impact of I4.0 on lean tools, using analysis of variance (ANOVA). Further, the authors drew a prioritization map of I4.0 on the employment of lean tools in manufacturing, using the Best–Worst Method (BWM).

Findings – The findings indicate that cloud manufacturing, simulation, industrial internet of things, horizontal and vertical integration impact 100% of the lean tools, while both cyber-security, big data analytics impact 93% of the lean tools and advanced robotics impact 74% of the lean tools. On the other hand, it is observed that augmented reality and additive manufacturing will impact 21% and 14% of the lean tools, respectively.

Practical implications – The results of this study would help practitioners draw up a strategic plan and roadmap for implementing lean 4.0. The amalgamation of lean with I4.0 technologies in the right combination would enhance speed productivity and facilitate autonomous operations.

Originality/value – Studies exploring the influence of I4.0 on lean manufacturing lack comprehensiveness, testing and validation. Importantly, no studies in the recent past have explored mapping and prioritizing I4.0 technologies in the “lean” context. This study thereby attempts to establish a conceptual

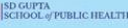

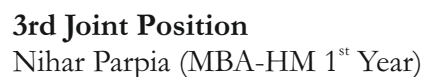
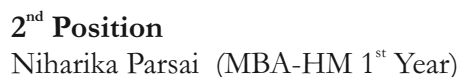

PMA (Performance Monitoring for Action) India – a project on family planning (FP) and other key health indicators disseminated survey results for 2021 today. IIHMR University implements the project PMA India in Rajasthan. The workshop was chaired by Dr. K L Meena, Director RCH, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of Rajasthan. Representatives from development partners, implementers, and researchers from across the country had also attended. Dr. K L Meena said "PMA India collects information on knowledge, practice, and coverage of family planning services in selected areas using a multi-stage stratified cluster design with urban-rural and region strata. The rapid turnaround survey reaches the stakeholders in very little time. With the use of technology and digital platform like PMA, the efforts for providing quality health care will be boosted." On this occasion Dr. Girish Dwedi, Project Director, Family Welfare, Govt. of Rajasthan said, "The data being released today is of great significance for the government. It will inform our policies and programs and help us to take data driven decision. PMA collects a nationally or sub-nationally representative sample of data from households and women in selected sites, to estimate family planning and other health indicators on an annual basis in nine pledging FP2020 countries." Dr. P R Sodani, President, IIHMR University, said, "PMA project was initially started by JHU and Jhpiego and in India IIHMR is leading this project. It is a multi-country study and provides actionable data. I would like to thank the government of Rajasthan for their continuous support towards our project, it is because of their support we are able to implement it successfully in Rajasthan."
