Maternal depression: Technology enabled self screening in real time

ABSTRACT

The first step toward providing treatment, is getting the right diagnosis in real time; before it is too late. Without this, resource deployment may appear to be comparable to the scale and scope of the problem, while in reality it may just be a drop in the ocean. Maternal depression, during pregnancy is a debilitating risk to both the mother and the child, but the bigger problem is, it goes unnoticed, undetected, and therefore untreated. If mobile technology can be deployed to screen for depression in real time by the pregnant mother herself, it will go miles in creating a HOPE for health.

Antenatal depression (AND) is a form of clinical depression that can affect a woman during pregnancy, it is also the leading cause of postpartum depression if not treated in time (Wilson, 2013). Researchers have found AND prevalence to range between 15 and 65%, and the pooled prevalence has been found to be greater in low and middle income countries as compared to high income countries (Dadi et al., 2020). World Bank officials report that there is still a poor coverage of data driven research from low income countries (The World Bank Group, 2016).

However the problem is not just that prevalence of AND is not well and widely researched and documented, but that due to the stigma attached with depression in many countries, and also due to lack of resources for treating the women thus diagnosed, the treatment gap is very wide.

The authors of the current research have tried to contribute a methodological literature on a self screening tool for antenatal depression via a mobile app, which can be used by a participating pregnant mother in any country and in any given language. It also gives a theoretical plan on how technology can be leveraged for treatment for depressed mothers - by connecting with health care providers in real time, and through personalized Artificial Intelligence (AI) enabled treatment options.

Strengthening institutions for public health education: results of an SWOT analysis from India to inform global best practices

Abstract

Background: Developing public health educational programs that provide workers prepared to adequately respond to health system challenges is an historical dilemma. In India, the focus on public health education has been mounting in recent years. The COVID-19 pandemic is a harbinger of the increasing complexities surrounding public health challenges and the overdue need to progress public health education around the world. This paper aims to explore strengths and challenges of public health educational institutions in India, and elucidate unique opportunities to emerge as a global leader in reform.

Methods: To capture the landscape of public health training in India, we initiated a web-based desk review of available offerings and categorized by key descriptors and program qualities. We then undertook a series of in-depth interviews with representatives from a purposively sample of institutions and performed a qualitative SWOT analysis.

Results: We found that public health education exists in many formats in India. Although Master of Public Health (MPH) and similar programs are still the most common type of public health training outside of community medicine programs, other postgraduate pathways exist including diplomas, PhDs, certificates and executive trainings. The strengths of public health education institutions include research capacities, financial accessibility, and innovation, yet there is a need to improve collaborations and harmonize training with well-defined career pathways. Growing attention to the sector, improved technologies and community engagement all hold exciting potential for public health education, while externally held misconceptions can threaten institutional efficacy and potential.

Conclusions: The timely need for and attention to public health education in India present a critical juncture for meaningful reform. India may also be well-situated to contextualize and scale the types of trainings needed to address complex challenges and serve as a model for other countries and the world.

Historically, educational systems that produce the health-care workforce in countries of all income levels have been inefficient in preparing adequate numbers or appropriate skill mixes of workers needed to solve complex health system challenges [1]. This holds true in India, with problems compounded by understaffed health systems, workforce shortages, under-subscribed training

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Study on Gender Disparity in Inpatient Care in India

Abstract: There are evidence of existing gender gap in healthcare in India with respect to region, socio-economic status, class, religion, caste, gender and sexuality but not much detailed study has been done in regards to gender gap in hospitalization (inpatient care). Our study aims to find the gender gap/differences in hospital care (inpatient care) and scrutinizing the factors pertaining to it. The data used for this study is collected from the three rounds of National Sample Surveys (NSS) namely the 60th round (2004), 71st round (2014) and the 75th round (2017-18). The raw data are extracted and organized into simple statistical tables applying sample weights. These tables are in turn used to analyze the inpatient hospitalization of the males and females. All the factors like rural-urban setting, age-wise variation, state-wise variation, ailment types, socio-economic groups, medical expenditure, average loss of household income and sources of financing hospitalization are taken into consideration and gender disparities are scrutinized. Significant gender gaps exist in hospital care (inpatient care) in India with respect to all the factors that are dealt with. There should be improvement in the health program designs and policy frameworks in terms of gender specificity as well as monitoring framework to keep a check on the gender issues.

1. INTRODUCTION

WHO (2011) defines Gender Equity as ‘a process of being fair to women and men with the objective of reducing unjust and unavoidable inequality between women and men in health status, access to health services and their contributions in the health workforce’. Universal Health Coverage (UHC) was launched in India with an aim to provide a complete spectrum of comprehensive, quality healthcare services to each and every Indian citizen irrespective of their socio-economic status or gender status without any financial problem, with expectations of achieving gender parity in health (Boerma *et al.*, 2014; Jaiswal and Jaiswal, 2013). Despite the steps being taken, there is a strong presence of health inequality which varies with respect to region, socio-economic status, class, religion, caste, gender and sexuality. 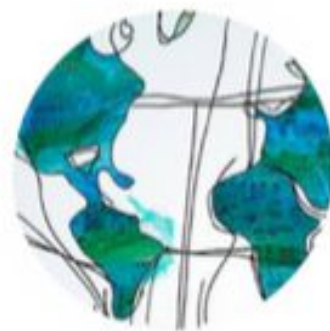
Establishment of Office for International Affairs

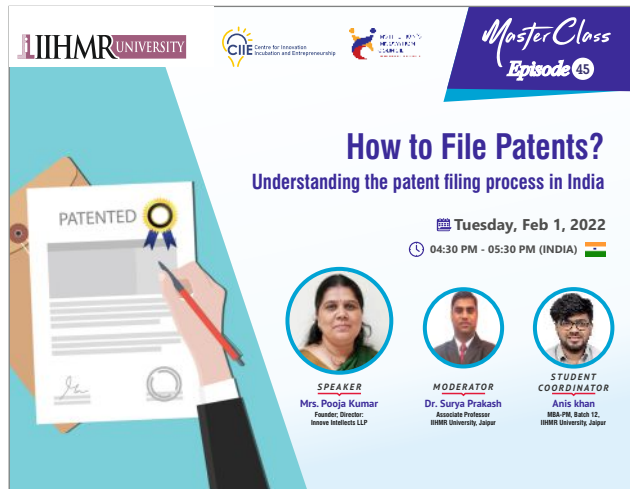

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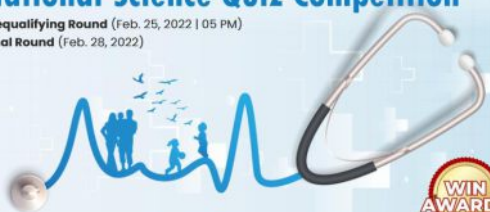
