I am pleased to share an overview of the University's key developments during May 2025. The month reflected steady progress across academics, research, strategic collaborations, and outreach.

Students commenced their summer internships and dissertation work with preparedness and commitment. Placements across 18 states and union territories, spanning both public and private sectors, reinforce the national presence and credibility of our programs. Encouragingly, 35% of internships are stipend-based, reflecting strong engagement with the industry.

Faculty members made impactful scholarly contributions, including six peer-reviewed publications, two book chapters, and two patent filings. Research collaborations progressed through our partnership with the Institute of Economic Growth on climate adaptation, and with WHO and the Government of Rajasthan for the Health Labour Market Assessment.

Capacity-building remained a priority, highlighted by a regional training program on Implementation Research involving participants from six countries. Additionally, a workshop in partnership with UNICEF focused on developing a behavioural parenting package for foster families, supporting child health and welfare initiatives.

The University also hosted a delegation from the University of Manchester to explore avenues for academic and research collaboration. Events such as MANTHAN 2025 and the Hackathon on multilingual AI further strengthened our commitment to innovation, digital transformation, and interdisciplinary learning.

I extend my sincere appreciation to all faculty, staff, students, and partners for their continued dedication. Let us move ahead with purpose and integrity, aligned with the mission and vision of IIHMR University.

Summer Training



All 395 MBA 2024-26 students have secured summer internships in various organizations for two months and fifteen days. The students across 18 States/UTs have been placed for their summer internships, reflecting our growing national presence. The summer internship organizations include hospitals, consultancies, health tech firms, pharma companies, and CSR foundations, indicating diverse opportunities for our students. This year, 35% of students secured internships with stipends, showcasing increased industry engagement. The highest stipend offered reached ₹40,000 per month, underscoring the value of our students in the healthcare and development sectors.

For the first time, the Department of Medical Education, Government of Rajasthan, approached to organize the summer internship for our students in the government medical college hospitals. Fifty-three students are undergoing summer internships with stipends at medical college hospitals in Rajasthan.

Economic and Health Impact Assessment of Heat Adaptation Action

IIHMR University, Jaipur, and the Institute of Economic Growth (IEG) Delhi signed a research agreement to work together on a project titled **Economic and Health Impact Assessment of Heat Adaptation Action: Case Studies from India**. IIHMR University, Jaipur, would provide support in conducting the study in Jaipur, Rajasthan, managing and supervising the data collection work, coordination with stakeholders, i.e., Indian Meteorological Department, Rajasthan, Department of Health and Family Welfare, Government of Rajasthan, Jaipur Municipal Corporation, Jaipur Development Authority, and with other stakeholders related to the project, and provide intellectual support. Prof. Purnamita Dasgupta, Professor, Institute of Economic Growth, visited IIHMR University and engaged in a meaningful discussion with Dr. P.R. Sodani, President, IIHMR University, along with Dr. Goutam Sadhu and Dr. Arindam Das, Professors at the University, to advance the collaborative research study aimed at tackling heat stress and safeguarding vulnerable communities in India through evidence-based strategies and impactful policy interventions.

Health Labour Market Assessment (HLMA) in Rajasthan

To achieve the goal of Universal Health Coverage, the health workforce is the most vital component of the Health Systems of a State. To analyze existing policies and practices and to develop recommendations for comprehensive and forward-looking Human Resources policy, the Department of Medical & Health, Government of Rajasthan, in collaboration with WHO and IIHMR University, Jaipur, conducted a Health Labour Market Assessment (HLMA) in Rajasthan. Considering the subject's multidimensionality, a state-level Technical Working Group (TWG) was constituted by the Government of Rajasthan to provide the necessary support for HLMA under the chairmanship of the Director (Public Health), Department of Medical & Health, Government of Rajasthan.

In this regard, WHO and IIHMR University, Jaipur, jointly organized the 2nd Meeting of the Technical Working Group (TWG) on May 9, 2025, at the State Institute of Health and Family Welfare, Jaipur. The agenda was to share the preliminary results and finalize study recommendations. Representatives from the Government of Rajasthan, WHO, and IIHMR University attended the TWG meeting.





Capacity Building Program on Implementation Research

IIHMR University, Jaipur successfully conducted a Capacity Building Program on Implementation Research from April 11 to May 24, 2025, in an online mode. Tailored specifically for SEAPHEIN member institutions, the program aimed to enhance institutional and individual capacities in implementation research. It provided in-depth learning on identifying public health challenges, setting priorities, performing root cause analyses, designing practical solutions, and planning effective implementation strategies. The sessions were led by distinguished global experts and resource persons. A total of 20 participants from six countries—India, Sri Lanka, Bhutan, Thailand, Bangladesh, and Myanmar—successfully completed the program.

Workshop on Behavioural Insights-based Parenting Package for Foster Families

In partnership with UNICEF, IIHMR University's Centre for Behavioural Sciences organized a Consultation Workshop on Conceptualization of a Behavioural Insights-Based Parenting Package for Foster Families on May 20-21, 2025, at the university campus. Key stakeholders, including representatives from the Department of Child Rights, Government of Rajasthan, Child Welfare Committee, Child Care Institution Udaipur, UNICEF, Foster Care Society in Udaipur, Centre of Excellence in Alternative Care, Jatan Sansthan, Action Aid, participated in the consultation.

In the inaugural session, Dr P.R. Sodani, President of IIHMR University, emphasized the critical need to pay attention to foster care for children. He also emphasized that the Centre for Behavioural Sciences works towards a parenting package for foster families. Dr. Sodani said the Centre works closely with the government, non-governmental organizations, development partners and communities to improve maternal and child health. 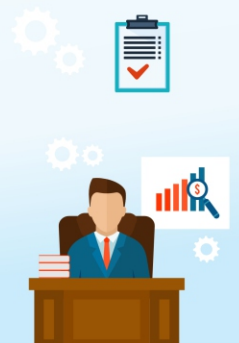

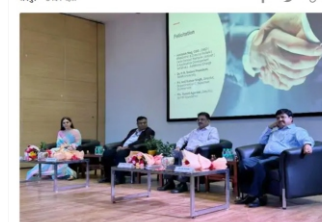
