



Memorandum of Understanding

This Memorandum of Understanding (“MoU”) is made on **July 07, 2026** between **IIHMR University**, having its registered office at 1, Prabhu Dayal Marg, Sanganer Airport, Jaipur, Rajasthan - 302 029, represented by Dr. P. R. Sodani, President, hereinafter referred to as the “First Party” (which term, unless repugnant to the context thereof, shall mean and include its legal heirs, successors, nominees, permitted assigns, etc.).

And

Academy of Hospital Administration (AHA), having its registered office at AHA House: C-56/43, Institutional Area, Sector-62, NOIDA, Uttar Pradesh – 201 301, represented by Maj Gen (Dr.) Jagtar Singh, Executive Director, AHA (hereinafter referred to as the “Second Party”, which term, unless repugnant to the context thereof, shall mean and include its successors and permitted assigns).

1. Partners Background

About IIHMR University, Jaipur

The genesis of the **IIHMR University, Jaipur** (First Party) dates to October 5, 1984, when the Indian Institute of Health Management Research (IIHMR) was established. The IIHMR University has been established and incorporated as a postgraduate research University by the Government of Rajasthan vide the IIHMR University, Jaipur Act, 2014 (Act No. 3 of 2014). IIHMR University is UGC-recognised and NAAC-accredited. IIHMR University is dedicated to the improvement in standards of health through better management of health care and related programs.

It seeks to accomplish this through management research, education, training, consultation, and networking from a national and global perspective. IIHMR University offers MBA (Hospital and Health Management), MBA (Pharmaceutical Management), MBA (Development Management), MBA (Healthcare Analytics), and Master of Public Health (Offered by Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, Baltimore, MD, USA in cooperation with IIHMR University, Jaipur, India), Master of Public Health, Executive Education Programs, Online Certificate Courses and PhD programmes.

IIHMR University’s global engagement is a defining pillar of its academic and research excellence. Its collaboration with Johns Hopkins University, USA, exemplifies a benchmark model of





international academic partnership in teaching and research. Beyond this, the University maintains active collaborations with institutions across the United Kingdom, the United States, Canada, Malaysia, Indonesia, and other countries, creating an environment that enables joint research, faculty exchange, and student exchange. These global partnerships enrich the academic ecosystem at IIHMR University, embed international perspectives in teaching and research, and expand pathways for graduates to build impactful careers worldwide.

About the Academy of Hospital Administration (AHA)

The **Academy of Hospital Administration (AHA)** is an autonomous professional organisation established in 1987 under the Societies Registration Act, 1860, at AIIMS, New Delhi. 2. Scope of MoU

The partnership will focus on collaboration across the following core areas:

1. **Executive Education & Capacity Building:** To jointly design, develop, and deliver Executive Education Programmes, Management Development Programmes (MDPs), Customised Training Programmes (CTPs), and institutional capacity-building initiatives.
2. **Collaborative Research & Consultancy:** To undertake joint research projects, consultancy assignments, policy studies, and knowledge-sharing activities in fields of mutual interest.
3. **Knowledge Events & Stakeholder Engagement:** To co-organize workshops, conferences, seminars, webinars, and high-level stakeholder consultations.

4. **Student Internships & Placements:** To facilitate experiential, field-based learning opportunities, internships, and potential placement avenues for IIHMR University students, subject to availability and institutional suitability.
5. **Academic & Industry Exchange:** To promote faculty exchanges, guest lectures, expert talks, and professional interactions aimed at strengthening the linkage between academia and industry practice.
6. **Joint Publications & Knowledge Products:** To co-author and publish training modules, case studies, policy briefs, research papers, and other professional knowledge products.
7. **Strategic Evolution:** To identify and pursue additional avenues of strategic cooperation as mutually agreed upon by both parties over the duration of this MoU.

3. Financial Arrangements

This MoU will not give rise to any financial obligation by one Party to the other. Each Party will bear its own costs and expenses in implementing this MoU.

4. Confidentiality

Each Party shall always maintain the utmost confidentiality regarding the contents of this MoU, and no Party shall use or disclose any confidential information of the other Party for any other purpose.

5. Force Majeure

Both Parties shall not be responsible for any failure to perform due to unforeseen circumstances or causes beyond their reasonable control, including but not limited to acts of nature, war, riots, embargoes, acts of civil or military authorities, fire, floods, accidents, terrorist acts, strikes, or shortages of transportation, facilities, fuel, energy, labor, or materials. If any such aspect is beyond the control of participating agencies, appropriate strategies would be worked out to compensate for the activities/ schedules accordingly.

6. Liability

Both Parties shall be solely liable for any damages/claims against them in connection with the exercise of the objectives of this MoU hereunder unless both parties agree otherwise. Liability for specific activities jointly undertaken by parties shall be referred to in the specific agreements executed.



7. Duration

The MoU would be effective for **three years** from the date of its execution (i.e., signing by both parties). It may be extended after the expiry of three years on such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon.

8. Termination

Either Party may terminate this MoU by written notice for 30 days without prejudice to any other remedy for any breach of the MoU.

9. Amendments

- Either Party may request in writing a revision, amendment or modification of all or any part of this MoU.
- Any revision, amendment or modification agreed to between the Parties shall be in writing and come into force on such date as determined by the Parties and shall form part of this MoU.

Conflict of Interest

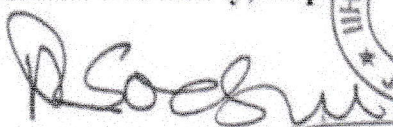
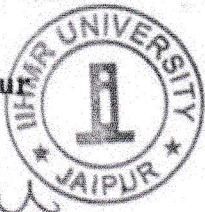
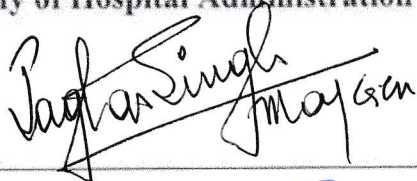
