# Introduction

## The University

IIHMR University, Jaipur has been established and incorporated as a postgraduate research University by Government of Rajasthan vide the IIHMR University Ordinance, 2013 (Ordinance No. 30 of 2013) promulgated on September 27, 2013 by the Governor which was replaced by the IIHMR University Act, 2014 (Act No. 3 of 2014) passed by the State Legislature on February 07, 2014. The Act of 2014 received the assent of the Governor on 25th day of February 2014 and was notified in the Rajasthan Gazette Extraordinary on February 26, 2014. It has deemed to have come into force on and from September 27, 2013.

## Origin

The genesis of the IIHMR University dates back to October 5, 1984, when its sponsoring body, the Indian Institute of Health Management Research (IIHMR) was established and registered as a non-profit Society under the Rajasthan Societies Registration Act, 1958. The Institute was established with a mission of improvement in standards of health through improved management of healthcare and related programmes through management research, education, training, consultation and institutional networking in a national and global perspective. IIHMR successfully created and established a new discipline of hospital management, health management in the country and over the last 36 years, IIHMR has established itself as a unique research, education and training organization in India and South-East Asian Region. After pursuing the cause of management research, academics and capacity building exclusively in the health sector for about three decades, the institute submitted a proposal before the State Government as per the guidelines for establishment of a private universities by separate Act. The proposal of the university was accepted by the Government of Rajasthan.

## Objectives

As defined in Section 4 of the IIHMR University Act, 2014, the objectives of the University shall be to undertake only postgraduate education and research in the disciplines specified in Schedule II and such other disciplines as the University may with prior approval of the State Government, determine from time to time and to achieve excellence and impart and disseminate knowledge in the said disciplines. The mandated disciplines which have been mentioned in Schedule II of the Act are as under:

## Endowment Fund

The endowment fund was created by the sponsoring body of IIHMR University by depositing Rs. Two Crores in the Public Deposit (PD) Account with the Government of Rajasthan on September 11, 2013 under Section 8 of The IIHMR University, Jaipur Act, 2014. This endowment fund shall be used, as a security deposit to ensure that the University complies and functions with the provisions of the Act. The income from the endowment fund may be utilized for the development of the infrastructure of the University.

## Collaborations

The University has been instrumental in setting up collaborations and networking globally with various national and international organizations to promote postgraduate education, research and capacity building in the mandated disciplines. The University takes pride in having of collaborative partnership with the following prestigious institutions and organizations:



Johns Hopkins University on behalf of its Bloomberg School of Public Health, Maternal and Child Health Center (herein referred to as "JHU") and the IIHMR University, Jaipur signed an MoU in a planned collaboration on public health research along with exchange of expertise and producing research outputs regarding public health research, training, and education priorities related to maternal and child health, covering national, regional and global perspectives.

To develop joint research proposals and grants in develop, design and organise joint training, education, and capacity building programmes in public health areas, seek opportunities for students at IIHMR University to receive scholarship support for post graduate studies.





The Curtin University, Perth, Australia entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with IIHMR University on August 31, 2016, for a period of five years. The MoU focusses on developments in learning and teaching quality, improving learning environment and opportunities for students, developing and sharing publications of common interest, organizing seminars and conferences, research collaborations and student exchange.



IIHMR University and The Université de Montréal, Montreal, Canada, have entered an MoU on September 21, 2016, for a period of 5 years. The agreement of cooperation, inter alia, includes exchange of faculty members, research scholars and students at all levels, joint research projects and joint mentoring programmes, organizing workshops, symposiums and conferences.



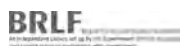
IIHMR University signed a cooperative agreement with Khesar Gyalpo University of Medical Sciences, Bhutan on November 11, 2016, for a period of 5 years. The agreement to specifically focus on exchange of faculty and staff; exchange of students and publications; academic materials and information on joint research activities and scholarship programmes; develop and conduct joint academic programmes, research grants; human resource development; developing collaborative external funding proposals; and other developmental activities is directed towards strengthening health systems in Bhutan including academic programmes.



South-East Asia Public Health Education Institution Network (SEAPHEIN) has been created by the WHO South-East Asia Regional Office to promote collaboration and sharing of information and knowledge among the member countries in the Region in pursuit of strengthening public health education and training. IIHMR University is a founding partner of the network and has signed agreements for collaboration with various institutions in SEARO countries to promote capacity building in public health, management and joint collaborative research.



To promote public health education in India, India Public Health Education Institution Network (IndiaPHEIN) has been developed and promoted under the stewardship of WHO-SEARO. The University hosts the Secretariat of IndiaPHEIN and plays a leading role in establishing the network to strengthen public health education in India.



IIHMR University has been collaborating with Bharat Rural Livelihoods Foundation (BRLF), an autonomous body of MoRD, GoI since 2017. The purpose of this MoU is to support Tribal Youth for MBA-Rural Management Programme and enhancing the aptitude and capability of tribal youth by supporting bright tribal graduates from central Indian tribal region to pursue a two-year MBA programme in Rural Management from School of Development Studies, IIHMR University. The central themes of the cooperation are to create multi-location, multi-thematic, multi-

partnered academic programmes for Scheduled Tribes, de-notified tribes, nomadic tribes, and other marginal social groups, with a special focus on youth and women, with the aim to develop them as rural livelihood/management professionals.



IIHMR University, Jaipur, India and Kandahar University, Kandahar, Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, have entered into a collaboration to establish a formal understanding of cooperation and friendship intended to enhance academic objectives further and promote better understanding between the faculty and students of IIHRMU and KU. The areas of cooperation include exchange of faculty members, exchange of students, joint research activities, participation in seminars and academic meetings, exchange of academic materials and other information, conduct short and long-term academic programmes, and pursue efforts to generate funds for the mentioned activities.



IIHMR University and Malviya National Institute of Technology (MNIT) entered into a collaboration in the areas of Teaching, Research, and Training in the domains of Public Health, Health and Hospital Administration, Pharmaceutical Management and Rural Development. The collaboration came into effect from February 08, 2019, for five years. This venture will especially focus on Student and Faculty exchange, partnering and supporting each other through joint research initiatives/projects, offering joint courses/programmes in areas of common interest, and other academic/professional activities such as organizing conferences/seminars.



IIHMR University in collaboration with Amrit Yoga Institute signed MoU on capacity building, exchange programmes, conducting workshops and joint research workshops in the area of healthcare, yoga, wellness and related areas.



IIHMR University signed an MoU with Commonwealth Infrastructure Partners Ltd. U.K. for furthering collaborations and development activities in the UK-India Context. The MoU will reinforce the 'aspects of cooperation' towards impinging 'Knowledge Management-Innovation-Institutional Development' measures by undertaking collaborative initiatives. The areas of cooperation include student exchange, international students in-take for the Graduate MBA Programmes at IIHMR University, design, develop and deliver on a techno-commercial mode, immersion programmes/mid-career executive education programmes for the administrators and business groups on thematic areas such as (a) Public Policy and Governance, (b) Health Care Management and (c) Public - Private Partnerships. The MoU aims to leverage 'Institutional Capacity Building Initiatives' for PSUs and Quasi Government Organizations in the Indian Region, to 'Design, Develop and Execute, one Summer School/Winter School' during May and December every year for graduate students of IIHMR University in the UK with (a) University of Sussex, (b) London-South Bank University and (c) University College London.



IIHMR University, Jaipur, India and B.N Patel Institute of Paramedical and Science, Anand (Gujrat) have entered into an MoU to establish a formal understanding of cooperation and friendship intended to conduct joint research in the areas of mutual interest, provide the manpower needed in the research and development, organize meetings, trainings and workshops, provide consultancy services in the areas of mutual interest and organize certificate courses in scientific and social science and research technologies. The areas of cooperation include exchange of staff and students in the areas of mutual interest, possible ways to develop research culture for the students in the institution and the scope of academic and outreach activities.



IIHMR University, Jaipur, India and Access Health International signed an MoU to establish terms and conditions for undertaking capacity building for enabling digital health future by conducting educational, training, mentoring, and skill development programmes for students, working executives and other human workforce dealing with healthcare, provide consultation to design innovative solutions and drive digital transformations for 3 Ps (Payers, Providers and Patients) of the health care ecosystem, conduct research to provide actionable insights through rigorous and actionable analysis, contributing to Universal Health Coverage and Sustainable Development Goals and to facilitate better interaction between the Incubation Centre of Access Health and Centre for Innovation, Incubation and Entrepreneurship (CIIE).



IIHMR University, Jaipur, India and Save the Children (Bal Raksha Bharat) signed an MoU to engage IIHMR University faculty as expert members in the TAG, develop SBCC strategy and health facility assessments, TAG Secretariat of Project Vishwas for holding quarterly review meetings, promote IIHMR University logo/ brand for all joint events/meetings under this MoU and provide exposure to IIHMR University students in intervention areas.



IIHMR University, Jaipur and Lords Education and Health Society (LEHS), New Delhi signed an MoU to conduct research activities and projects by the scientific personnel of the parties and seek mutual advice and support in planning and executing programmes, promoting excellence in primary healthcare research, improve the primary healthcare system, planning, and policymaking through evidence-based documentation/health technology assessments/third party validation of findings, development of guideline, capacity building, and advocacy at different levels, support research designs/tools for various studies vis-à-vis utilization of existing institutional/ ethical review committee/board for initiating studies in the field, organize conferences/symposia of national and international importance in primary healthcare/digital health/ innovations for primary health care and like?, explore strategic partnerships with the potential development partners, donors and other stakeholder institutions for developing and implementing joint projects/programmes.



Jhpiego and IIHMR University, Jaipur have signed an MoU to be a learning partner network envisaged under NISHTHA project. Under the collaboration, partners would share the learnings from each other's experience in comprehensive primary healthcare. The collaboration will lead to design and implement operational research in the context of comprehensive primary health care. Learning partners and part of learning partner network envisaged under NISHTHA Project. The area of cooperation includes, partner collaborate and share the learnings from each other's experience in the areas of comprehensive primary healthcare, advocate the learnings in the field of CPHC with different stakeholders, disseminate the lessons learned from the experiences in CPHC through the work of respective partners, collaborate to design, implement any operational research in the context of CPHC.



Society for Education, Action and Research in Community Health (SEARCH) and IIHMR University, Jaipur signed an MoU for Joint Research and Education. IIHMR University students get internship opportunities and field exposure in SEARCH, the local community as well as hospital-based programme and research. Involvement of IIHMRU faculty in SEARCH's existing research projects, data analysis and writing joint research papers for publication, involvement of IIHMRU faculty in exploring new research studies with SEARCH, writing joint research proposals and grants in public health areas. Develop, design and organize joint training and capacity building programmes in public health areas.



American Society for Quality India Pvt. Ltd. (ASQ India) and IIHMR University, Jaipur signed an MoU for Joint Research and Education to provide services in quality management, quality improvement and healthcare excellence, exposure to the global best practices that will help students to bridge gap with industry, with better chances of placement in India as well as abroad. Jointly organize conferences, seminars, and other academic events of mutual interest and establishment of student chapters mentored by industry experts.



Medvarsity Online Limited and IIHMR University, Jaipur signed an MoU to foster cooperation in healthcare education and jointly conduct and run academic Programmes at a mutually agreed course fee and certification to be awarded jointly by IIHMR and Medvarsity on the successful completion of the programme, Short Duration Courses in the form of Masterclass, Short Term Courses in Pharmaceutical Management and Collaborative Executive Education Degree, Certificate, Diploma as per the guidelines of UGC/regulatory bodies.



Medanta Institute of Education and Research and IIHMR University, Jaipur signed an MoU for Joint Research and Education with an objective to support and promote educational and research activities in the area of health sciences and to collaborate for purpose of permitting the scholars/researchers of IIHMR University to undertake research at Medanta. IIHMR University will send PhD research scholars for undertaking hospital-based research studies to Medanta Institute of Education and Research (MIER).



Shalby Academy and IIHMR University, Jaipur signed an MoU to increase the knowledge, practice and competencies of those engaged in public health, healthcare management, hospital administration and management by providing training, teaching, e-courses with hands on exercise collaboratively by IIHMR-U and Shalby, develop and deliver technical content of courses/short term trainings through its faculty, organise and manage the online content, virtual content, responding to queries to participants, provide E-Platform, co-branding of the courses, provide hands on exercise at Shalby facility, propose and lead the demand generation activities, joint certificate of completion, permit to use Shalby campus facility for delivery of courses/training.



University of Manchester Institute of Health Policy and Organisation and IIHMR University, Jaipur signed an MoU for Joint Research and Education with a mutual interest in establishing closer working relationships in respect of research, education, the application of scientific knowledge.



SDG Choupal and IIHMR University signed an MoU for Sustainable Development with an objective of implementation of SDGs and joint efforts PAN India. IIHMR University as part of SDG Choupal alliance. For any specific SDG implementation project related activities, IIHMR University will develop initiative specific collaborative action plan.

## The Board of Management

The Board of Management is the principal executive body of the University. All the movable and immovable property of the University vests in the Board of Management. ## Meetings of the Board of Management

During the Year 2020-21, the meetings of the Board were held in accordance with the provisions of the Act and Statutes made thereunder. The eighteenth meeting of the Board was held on June 17, 2020 and the nineteenth meeting of the Board was held on September 18, 2020. The minutes of the meetings were shared with the Board members.

## The Statutes

The statutes were prepared by the University and the Board of Management approved them in its second meeting dated July 28, 2014. The statutes were sent to the State Government for approval on July 31, 2014. The Joint Secretary, Higher Education Department, requested the University on September 03, 2014, to modify the statutes as per the corrections made at appropriate places. The University modified the statutes and submitted before the Joint Secretary on September 11, 2014. Thereafter, the Joint Secretary again raised some queries on June 15, 2015, October 16, 2015 and December 08, 2015, respectively. All the relevant queries were replied instantly but still the statutes are under consideration with the State Government.

## The Academic Council

The Academic Council is the principal academic body of the University and subject to the provisions of the Act and the Statutes, Regulations and Ordinances. It co-ordinates and exercises general supervision over the University's academic policies. The first Academic Council was constituted on December 07, 2013 under section 23 of the IIHMR University, Jaipur Ordinance, 2013 (Ordinance No. 30 of 2013). The 4th Academic Council of the IIHMR University, Jaipur is constituted on February 10, 2021. The composition of the Council is as under:

# Core Activities

## RESEARCH

IIHMR University is primarily a research University. It has enabling ambiance and adequate infrastructure for conducting high-quality research. The University has created conducive conditions to enquire into the contemporary research questions with transparency, trust, accountability, and autonomy. The University organizes regular programmes to build the capacity of the faculty and research staff in planning, designing, and conducting research workshops, training, seminars, and conferences. Every year, the University earmarks budget for in-house research grants to promote research activities in the University. The research activities are given due credit in the Key Result Areas of the faculty members in their annual performance appraisal. Most faculty members actively participate in the processes of the research activity including research project-proposal submission, implementation, data analysis, report writing, and taking feedback from the funding agency.

## Research and Consulting

The University has worked for various agencies that fund research in the areas of health, hospital, nutrition, water, and sanitation. It submitted 37 research proposals in the year 2020-21. The clients were JSI, WHO, MAMTA, CARE India, Save the Children, UNFPA, ICMR, UNICEF, Tata Trust and State Institute of Health and Family Welfare, Rajasthan. The awarded research projects in 2020-21 were in the fields of WASH, COVID-19 and training of health workforce.

During the year 2020-21, the University completed one research project. The information on completed and ongoing research projects is summarized in Table 1.

### **National Health Mission (NHM) in developing capacities of health care functionaries on Infection Prevention Control and WASH protocols in health care facilities under COVID-19 context in select districts and scale-up across the State in Madhya Pradesh**

UNICEF, Madhya Pradesh (MP) in partnership with National Health Mission (NHM), MP aims to build the capacity of the state and district level officials for improvement of Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) in Health Centres and Nutritional Rehabilitation Centre (NRC) in selected districts of MP. The programme was implemented by IIHMR University, Jaipur in nine high priority districts (HPDs) named Vidisha, Indore, Barwani, Guna, Sheopur, Shivpuri, Alrajpur and Jhabua with the following aim:

- Build capacity of healthcare staff, consultants, and mentors on WASH related issues, especially demonstration of safe WASH practices in the COVID-19 pandemic situation, protocol in the HCF as per the WHO, UNICEF and Gol guidelines on the preventive measures of COVID-19, Infection Prevention Control and use of monitoring tools, including support implementation of WASH improvement plans.
- Assess the status of WASH infrastructure, services, and systems in the selected facilities.
- Develop facility wise phased WASH improvement plans by the agency team, mentor team, BMOs and the MoICs.
- Handholding support to MoICs/Health staff in operationalization & monitoring of the WASH improvement plans.
- Sharing the findings of assessment and operationalization of improvement plans with NHM implementers and policymakers for improved action and resourcing for WASH in health in Health and Contribute to state strategy and statement of procedures (SoPs).

During project period around 450 health professionals including Deputy Director (Quality Assurance), State Consultants from NHM, Chief Medical & Health Officer (CMHOs), DPMs, Medical Officers of facilities, In-charge Medical officers of NRCs, DCM, Programme officers were trained online on the aspect of WASH and in the COVID-19 pandemic situation, protocol in the HCF as per the WHO, UNICEF and Gol guidelines on the preventive measures of COVID-19 and on Infection Prevention Control measures.

The divisional level workshop was also organized to ensure impact in the health facilities of the 32 ODF block spread across another 11 districts. Key findings were shared with the Mission Director and other stakeholders to bring attention to making a separate policy on WASH for health facilities for making the significant and sustainable change.

Capacity building training on LaQshya were also conducted in 6 batches in project districts (Sheopur-1, Shivpuri-1, & 4 at Alirajpur) in which 60 healthcare professionals including medical officers were oriented towards LaQshya protocol. Training was also given to the healthcare providers on how to bring changes by involving themselves in assessment and developing improvement programme. The changes were measured by Star grading tools, which revealed that around 76 percent of the facilities were achieved more than 75 percent on WASH compliances, and around half of the facilities comply up-to 90 percent of the WASH parameters.

## ACADEMICS

IIHMR University has been the pioneer institution of higher learning which developed a new discipline of Health Management in the country. Initially, it was engaged only in health research and capacity building of the human resource involved in the managing and implementing the healthcare programmes. The first academic programme “Postgraduate Diploma in Hospital and Health Management” was launched by the IIHMR in the year 1996. Within a short span of 3-4 years, the programme became an acclaimed management course. For more than two decades the alumni of the IIHMR have been instrumental in efficiently managing the healthcare institutions throughout the country and overseas.

### Admission Procedure

The University has a comprehensive admission policy duly approved by the Academic Council and the Board of Management. The selection of students is based on past academic performance, MAT or equivalent scores, experience, Group Discussion and Personal Interview. An appropriate weightage is given to each element. The admission process of the University is transparent, which is solely based on equity and merit. The results are declared immediately after the Group Discussion and Personal Interview is over.

The University adheres to the policy of the State Government on reservations for the students belonging to SC, ST, OBC, differently abled and women candidates.

- **MBA Pharmaceutical Management**

Recognized bachelor's degree of minimum 3 Years duration with at least 50% marks (45% for SC, ST and OBC candidates) in aggregate in any discipline (Medicine/Pharmacy/Biotechnology/Science/Management) with valid score of Management Aptitude Tests. Candidates with relevant experience in the pharmaceutical sector are encouraged to apply.

- **MBA Development Management**

Recognized bachelor's degree of minimum 3 Years duration with at least 50% (45% for SC, ST and OBC candidates) marks in aggregate in any discipline (Medicine/Pharmacy/Biotechnology/Science/Management) with valid score of Management Aptitude Tests. Candidates with relevant experience in the rural management/development sector are encouraged to apply.

- **Ph.D**

Recognized masters' degree or Post-Graduate Diploma in Management (PGDM) from a UGC/AICTE recognized institution or University, with at least 55% marks (50% marks for SC/ST candidates) or equivalent grade in hospital and health management, general management, medicine, nursing, pharmacy, health informatics, social and behavioral sciences, economics, commerce, science, demography and statistics. Faculty and working professionals with relevant qualifications and experience are encouraged to join the programme. IIHMR University encourages working professionals (health administrators, policy makers, and medical/nursing/pharmaceutical/development sectors/management professionals) to undertake the Ph.D Programme to enhance competence in evidence-based research for policy and programme development.

- **Master of Public Health**

Should have a bachelor's degree; A minimum of two years of full-time health-related experience beyond the bachelor's/master's degree (work experience is waived for PhD and MBBS.); Prior college-level mathematics courses; prior college-level biology course plus another health-related course; Demonstrated English proficiency through prior degree, TOEFL or IELTS, Demonstrated quantitative and verbal skill through GRE, MCAT, LSAT or GMAT. (Applicants with degrees beyond the bachelor's degree may request a waiver of standardized test scores if they have other sources of quantitative abilities.)

## Diversity

The University highly values diversity in all the academic programmes. The table given above manifestly depicts that 64.5% of the students are females and they represent various states of the country. University has a good amount of regional diversity in terms of enrolled students as well as workforce. They come from diverse academic backgrounds like Medicine, Dentistry, Science and Technology, AYUSH, Arts, Nursing, Biotechnology, Pharmacy, Management, Commerce etc. The Master of Public Health programme which is offered in academic collaboration with Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, USA, is open to candidates from South-East Asian countries.

## Academic Session Plan

The Academic Plan of the University is prepared in consultation with the Deans, the President and the Registrar. The students' feedback is considered while finalizing the session plan. The academic plan is submitted to the Academic Council of the University for approval before the commencement of the academic session. After obtaining approval from the Academic Council, the plan is shared with faculty members and students. The plan is also displayed on the University website.

## TRAINING

The Executive Education Division of the University focused on four main portfolios including: Management Development Programmes (MDPs); Customized Training Programmes (CTP)s; Executive Degree programmes; and UGC National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) approved Post Graduate Diploma programmes. The training and capacity building efforts of the university benefited huge number of policy makers, advisors, hospital managers, health managers, planners, decision-makers, and pharmaceutical professionals at the national and international levels to improve the leadership and management skills.

From April 2020 to March 2021, we have done 21 programmes including 17 Online Management Development Programmes (MDPs) and 4 onsite Customized Training Programmes (CTP)s. In all, 535 participants attended these programmes. The participants were from the following 41 countries: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Gambia, India, Japan, Kenya, Liberia, Lebanon, Lagos, Nepal,

Myanmar, Uganda, Nigeria, Maldives, Tongo, Papua New Guinea, Sri Lanka, Thailand, USA, Yemen, Ethiopia, Czech Republic, Pakistan, Philippines, Oman, Malaysia, Algeria, England, United Arab Emirates, Indonesia, Turkey, Zimbabwe, North Macedonia, Cyprus, Qatar, Belarus, China. The Indian participants were from 12 states: Assam, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh Haryana, Delhi, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh.

## Management Development Programmes (MDPs)

- 1. Data Analytics Using R, June 19-23, 2020:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. The major objectives of the programme were to understand the nuances of data collection and processing, familiar with functioning of R and R-Project, apply the descriptive analytics using R, apply the Predictive Analytics using R. The programme was attended by 153 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Prashant Sharma.
- 2. How to Conduct Qualitative Research, June 25-28, 2020:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 4-day duration. The major objectives were to understand a general definition of research design able to identify the overall process of designing a research study from its inception to its report, familiar with ethical issues in educational research, including those issues that arise in using quantitative and qualitative research, familiar with conducting a literature review for a scholarly educational study, distinguish a purpose statement, a research question or hypothesis and steps in the process of quantitative data collection. The programme was attended by 23 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Harsh Jha.
- 3. Data Analytics Using R, July 1-5, 2020:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. The major objectives of the programme were to understand the nuances of data collection and processing, familiar with functioning of R and R-Project, apply the descriptive analytics using R, apply the Predictive Analytics using R. The programme was attended by 37 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Prashant Sharma.
- 4. R Programing for Non-Programmers, July 15-19, 2020:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. The objectives of the programme were to understand how to install R and R studio, how to read files and manipulate data, understand major data structures, Access data from vectors, list, matrices using different operations, perform data manipulation on your data imported from files. The programme was attended by 37 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Shweta Agarwal.
- 5. Qualitative and Quantitative Data Analytics Using R, August 17-22, 2020:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 6-day duration. The objectives of the programme were to be familiar with the characteristics of different types of data and its processing for analysis, familiar with functioning of R and R-Studio, understand and apply the descriptive analytics using R, understand and apply the predictive Analytics using R, understand text mining using R. The programme was attended by 7 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Prashant Sharma.
- 6. Happiness Quotient – Our Own Measure, August 20-22, 2020:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 3-day duration. The objectives of the programme were enhancing physical and emotional health reduce stress, develop professional outlook with traditional roots, increase self-

awareness and wellness, guide for mindful behaviour in an organization, improve sensitivity and sensibility in handling challenges, develop spontaneous expression and communication skills, harmonize living and overall improvement for greater happiness quotient. The programme was attended by 7 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Padmaja Suresh.

7. **Data Use in Public Health Management, August 24-28, 2020:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. The objectives of the programme were how data-use can become part of each step of the public health management. In the course it was discussed that the importance of data use, how to go from raw data to useable information, how to analyze data quality and what implications this gives in data use, how to identify situations where data use is necessary and how data should be used in different scenarios such as project planning, M&E and disease surveillance. Data use culture and challenges with data use was also discussed. The course gave relatable examples from a public health practitioner's perspective to demonstrate how the principles should be used. The programme was attended by 8 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Anna Baisiton.
8. **Effective Classroom Management Using Google Tools, September 7-11, 2020:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. The objectives of the programme were to make participants comfortable in the online classroom, and expand their learning level, move beyond fundamentals, and learn the cutting-edge tools for integrating in your teaching, helping educators what they do best, even better and to provide interactive online training for professional development. The programme was attended by 21 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Sheenu Jain.
9. **Managing people: Emerging Issues and Shifting work Practices, September 7-11, 2020:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. The objectives of the programme were to explore the various changes taking place in market and its impact on working professionals in corporates; analyse the shifts in expectations of employees in corporates and to prepare for it; understand the challenges many corporate leaders are facing and their impact on workplace; understanding the requirement for changing work processes and work set up and adopt them for effective business performance; build strategy for converting the challenges into opportunities and taking all in one direction. The programme was attended by 2 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Deepti Sharma.
10. **Healthcare Operations Management -Techniques and Applications, October 12-17, 2020:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. The objectives of the programme were to understand the operations management techniques which could be used in taking decisions about delivering healthcare of high quality, evaluate hospital projects with PERT/CPM techniques, understand Inventory Control Techniques - EOQ & ABC analysis in hospitals, forecasting techniques in healthcare operations, queuing and capacity planning in hospitals, quality management – tools and techniques in healthcare operations, use of software for decision sciences. The programme was attended by 32 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Susmit Jain.
11. **Analytics and Decision Support in Health Care Operations Management, November 27-29, 2020:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. The objectives of the programme were to recognize the various analytical techniques for decisions about delivering

healthcare of high quality, understand the PERT/CPM project management technique and use of software for analysis, understand inventory management techniques – EOQ & ABC analysis. understand the concept of Six Sigma Quality Improvement in hospitals, use of software for decision sciences. The programme was attended by 24 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Susmit Jain.

12. **Financial Statement Analysis for Managers of Hospitals and Healthcare Organizations, January 4-8, 2021:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. The objectives of the programme were to train participants how to read the financial statements of healthcare/hospital organizations, analyse the financial statements using appropriate techniques, evaluate the financial health of the healthcare/hospital organizations, use Ms-Excel effectively for financial statement analysis. The programme was attended by 8 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Prashant Sharma.
13. **Quantitative Decision-Making Methods in Health care Management, March 19-21, 2021:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. The objectives of the programme were to understand the fundamentals of quantitative and operations research techniques in healthcare, evaluate hospital/health projects with PERT/CPM technique, describe linear programming methodology and its use in resource allocation, understand EOQ, ABC, and queuing model formulations in hospital services, understand the concept of Six Sigma Quality and SQC charts in hospitals, using Software of decision sciences. The programme was attended by 8 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Susmit Jain.

### ***IHMR - Custom Training Programmes***

1. **Vaccine Economics for COVID-19, October 17-December 17, 2020:** IIHMR University, Jaipur, India in collaboration with The Johns Hopkins, Bloomberg School of Public Health, WITS School of Public Health, Aga Khan University, and Makerere University have developed a series of training workshops to strengthen skills related to economics and financing of national immunization programmes to improve the sustainability of vaccine delivery in low and middle-income countries. The programme provided a rare and unique opportunity to interact with subject experts. This programme was designed for professionals involved in planning and implementation of immunization programmes and projects including government representatives (national, state-level, district-level) as well as vaccine policy analysts in NGOs at any stage of their career. 2. **Management Training of Administrative Nursing Cadre for Government of Madhya Pradesh, February 22-26, 2021- Batch 1:** With the intention to enhance the management and administrative skills of nursing managers and administrators, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of Madhya Pradesh approached IIHMR University, Jaipur. As per the request of Government of Madhya Pradesh, IIHMR University develop a brief proposal to conduct the training programme for their nursing cadre working in the district hospitals, CHCs and PHCs. After reviewing the proposal, Government of Madhya Pradesh awarded the training to IIHMR University to train their 81 nursing staff, which of mixed group, who are working as District Public Health Nurse Officer (DPHNO), Matrons, and Nursing Sisters. IIHMR University has completed the total training in four batches. The first batch of the training programme was organized during February 22-26, 2021. The training was intended to create and share good understanding of different functional and behavioral

competencies, required for delivering high-quality and people-centric nursing services. The programme was attended by 23 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Shiv K Tripathi.

3. **Women Entrepreneurship Development Programme, March 1-April 11, 2021:** Women Entrepreneurship Development Programme (WEDP) under the Department of Science & Technology scheme aims to train the S&T graduates and diploma holders in the entrepreneurship essentials - conceive, plan, initiate, launch and maintain economic activity or run a successful enterprise. WEDP selected 30 potential women entrepreneurs and trained them through a structured 4-week training programme. The online training pedagogy followed a mix of theoretical sessions, practicals and case-based discussions. In all, the programme was attended by 30 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Sheenu Jain.
4. **Management Training of Administrative Nursing Cadre for Government of Madhya Pradesh, March 1-5, 2021- Batch 2:** The second batch of the training programme was organized during March 1-5, 2021. The programme objective was to create and share good understanding of different functional and behavioral competencies, required for delivering high-quality and people-centric nursing services. The programme was attended by 22 participants, who are working as District Public Health Nurse Officer (DPHNO), Matrons, and Nursing Sisters in district hospital, CHC and PHCs of Department of Health and Family Welfare, Government of Madhya Pradesh. ### ***SPM - Management Development Programme***

1. **Building Brand Effectiveness, August 14-22, 2020:** The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. This programme is designed with an aim to provide participants with a 360-degree view of various practical and applicable aspects of managing pharmaceutical brands & pharmaceutical marketing communication that includes understanding different types of pharmaceutical markets, competition, doctor prescription behavior and brand building. A sound understanding of such fundamentals helps participants appreciate concepts of segmentation,



targeting, positioning differentiating, pricing, and branding strategies which are necessary to design effective pharmaceutical marketing and branding strategies for the pharmaceutical organization. The programme concluded with sessions on integrated communication and digital marketing which are extremely relevant in the growing e-world. In all, the programme was attended by 19 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Sandeep Narula.

### ***SDS - Management Development Programmes***

**1. Foundational Education Leadership for Early Childhood care and Education, July 8-12, 2020:**

The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. The programme objective was aimed at existing and potential teacher leaders to provide them with the tools to lead this change in this era of technology and information/resource deluge on the web especially in the post-COVID era when parents are deliberating of educating their pre- schoolers at home. In all, the programme was attended by 3 participants. The programme was coordinated by Mr. Rajiv Ranjan.

**2. Optimizing Corporate Social Responsibility for Greater Good, September 23-October 9, 2020:**

The programme was organized on online mode, and it was of 5-day duration. The programme objective were to create better understating about New CSR Law under Company Act, 2013, enable participants to acquire the skills and competencies required to undertake effective planning and implementation of the CSR Agenda, provide tools and practical framework to improve CSR decision making, manage risks, measure performance, and to create and leverage partnerships, help move away from conventional philanthropy to community's need oriented initiatives through objective stakeholder-engagement-processes, develop understanding on how money spent could cover larger social and environmental issues, enable participants to learn from the experiences of industry leaders in the panel discussion and their peers working in the field, appreciate how sustainability reporting could be an effective and transparent mode of communicating with all the stakeholders. The programme was attended by 19 participants. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Sazzad Parwez.

## Resources and Support Facilities

The University has adequate human resources for efficiently carrying out the various activities of the University. The IIHMR University Act of 2014 manifestly provides details of the infrastructure available in the University in Schedule-I appended thereto. The Expert Committee, constituted by the UGC, also observed that the University's infrastructure is adequate and well maintained.

## Intellectual Capital

During the year 2020-21, the University had a cohort of 48 full-time faculty members. Most of the faculty members had PhD as the highest educational degree. The faculty members are engaged in teaching, training, and research. The University faculty is multi-disciplinary in the areas of Health Management, Public Health, Hospital Management, Pharmaceutical Management, Rural Management, Demography, Statistics, Management, Health Economics, Finance and Social Sciences. The performance of the faculty is measured by the President and the respective Deans based on their work as expected from them.

The University follows the service conditions as laid down by the UGC. The University advertises the vacant positions in national dailies as well as notifying the vacancies on employment related websites. A selection board, duly headed by the President, constituted by the Chairman of the University conducts interviews and selects the appropriate person for the vacant slot. The process of recruitment is transparent and independent.

### **I.T. Centre**

The computer centre is well equipped with state-of-the-art computing resources to cater the need of the academic as well as administrative activities of the University. The centre has adequate infrastructure and is working 24x7 throughout the year. Besides providing support to the ongoing activities of the university like research, teaching, training and consultancy, the centre is actively engaged in software development in the field of health and hospitals.

The prominent features of the centre are newest servers, latest computers, laptops, laser printers, video conference facility, interactive classrooms, LCD projectors, online UPS, email server, technically competent software and hardware professionals. The centre is having cloud-based campus agreement with Microsoft which allows using different Microsoft packages for academics. Apart from this, centre is also having statistical packages (SPSS, STATA, ATLAS. Ti), ARC GIS, Microsoft office, Antivirus software. The centre is also having perpetual software licenses and dedicated hardware for managing e-learning courses.

The centre has fiber optic based wired and Wi-Fi based wireless local area network connecting nodes throughout the campus. Centre is also outfitted with windows server and other servers for better communication and interconnection at internal and external level.

Fast speed internet access is available with the help of dedicated (1:1) Lease line. Internet facility is made available to the staff, student and training participants for external communication and for global exposure to research and training. Use of internet is closely monitored by a powerful Unified Threat Management appliance fulfilling the norms of Ministry of Communication and IT (DoT, Gol).

IIHMR University has implemented ERP and CollPoll in all its internal processes. A competent team of individuals from the IT Department, with the help of other major departments in the university, has successfully implemented the ERP and CollPoll. The ERP and CollPoll is a user friendly and handy system that has been carried out to ensure automation and online functioning.

During the COVID pandemic, IIHMR University has implemented the online admission process, online classes on Microsoft Team and online examination system as new technologies implemented for effective functioning.

Well qualified team is enthusiastically mixed up in developing and managing internal, external software package and research tools. The research tools are developed using specific technologies for effective use of computers science in the domain of Public Health.

The centre acts as a central nervous system ensuring efficient digital operations and bringing life to every activity of the University.

## Dr. D. A. Henderson Library and Documentation Centre

On May 31, 1996, The IIHMR University Library and Documentation Centre was dedicated to Dr. D. A. Henderson, renowned for his outstanding contribution to eradicating smallpox.

The University's Library is housed in a centrally located main University building spread across 292.314 sq. mt. (approximately). Spacious reading halls and the latest IT infrastructure provide the right environment for reading and research in the library. The library is developing a comprehensive collection of print, digital and media resources on Public Health, Health Systems, Health and Hospital, Pharmaceutical Management, and Development Studies, to fulfill the teaching and research needs of the three schools of the University.

The objective of the library is to provide appropriate and adequate material in a minimum amount of time enabling them to achieve excellence in research, teaching, learning, and community services.

It is to be noted that this is the first automated library in the state. It is divided into three functional units viz., Technical Unit, Documentation Unit and Information Unit. The staff maintains the records through KOHA (version: 19.11.05.000). The library has a Wi-Fi facility, circulation, web OPAC, and a digital repository available through Greenstone software. The IIHMR University Library also provides RemoteXs facility to current students and faculty.

### Publication

The Library publishes abstracts of the dissertation submitted by the MBA students. The IIHMR University Library and Documentation Centre, Jaipur, is annually bringing out a publication "Abstracts of Dissertations" since 2010. It is a continued, systematic, and sincere effort to Collect and collate abstracts of students' dissertations.

### Library Resources

The university library collection is mainly focused on Health Management, Hospital Administration, Health Economics and Finance, Public Health, General Management, Management Information Systems, Population, Research Methodology, Sociology, Economics, Rural Management, Pharmaceutical Management and Computer Science. The library also has a collection of books of general interest, valuable reference books. It has a collection of more than 32785 volumes, including textbooks, reference books, training materials, case studies.

The university library receives over 113 periodicals (print) of professional and research interest and a few periodicals of general interest and newsletters published around the globe. The library collection also includes CD-ROMs and databases from India and abroad like Health Plan, Popline, e-TALC etc.

## Grievance Redressal Committee

To ensure transparency in admissions with the paramount objective of preventing unfair practices and to provide a mechanism to students for redressal of their grievances, a University Level Grievance Redressal Committee has been constituted in the University. - Making admission contrary to merit determined in accordance with the policy of the University.
- Irregularity in the admission process adopted by the University.
- Refusing admission in accordance with the declared admission policy of the University.
- Withhold or refuse to return any document in the form of certificates of degree, diploma or any other award or other document deposited with it by a person for the purpose of seeking admission in such University, with a view to induce or compel such person to pay any fee or fees in respect of any course or programme of study which such person does not intend to pursue.
- Demand of money in excess of that specified in the declared admission policy or approved by the competent authority to be charged by such institution.
- Breach of the policy for reservation in admission as may be applicable.
- Complaints of alleged discrimination by students from Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes, OBC, women, minority or disabled categories.
- Non-payment or delay in payment of scholarships to any students that such institution is committed.
- Delay in conducting examinations or declaration of results beyond that specified in the academic calendar.
- On provision of student amenities as may have been promised or required to be provided by the institution.

- Denial of quality education as promised at the time of admission or required to be provided.
- Non-transparent or unfair evaluation practices.
- Harassment and victimization of students including sexual harassment.
- Refund of fees on withdrawal of admissions as per university norms.

The Board will be in operation for a period of two years with effect from April 2, 2020. The main role of the committee will be to review the research proposals and grants from ethics perspectives of research on



human subjects. The committee will follow the ICMR's Ethical Guidelines for Biomedical and Social Health research on Human subjects. The committee may also invite special invitee, if required.

## **Internal Quality Assurance Cell**

IIHMR University relentlessly strives towards achieving excellence in research, academics and capacity building related to Health Management through institutionalized quality control processes. In pursuance of the instructions given by the Expert Committee of the University Grants Commission, the University hereby establishes an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC).

The mandate given to IQAC is to develop a system for uninterrupted, conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the performance of core activities of the University and to improve academic, research, training and administrative capabilities of the University.

The policy documents of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) are the basis for formulating the role and responsibility of IQAC.

### **Broad objectives of the IQAC are as follows:**

- To develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution.
- To promote measures for institutional functioning towards quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and institutionalization of best practices.

### **Main functions of the IQAC are as follows:**

- Development and application of quality benchmarks parameters for various academic and administrative activities of the institution;
- Facilitating the creation of a learner-centric environment conducive to quality education and faculty maturation to adopt the required knowledge and technology for participatory teaching and learning process;
- Collection and analysis of feedback from all stakeholders on quality-related institutional processes;
- Dissemination of information on various quality parameters to all stakeholders;
- Organization of inter and intra institutional workshops, seminars on quality related themes and promotion of quality circles;
- Documentation of the various programmes/ activities leading to quality improvement;
- Acting as a nodal agency of the Institution for coordinating quality-related activities, including adoption and dissemination of best practices;
- Development and maintenance of institutional database through MIS for the purpose of maintaining/ enhancing the institutional quality;
- Periodical conduct of Academic and Administrative Audit and its follow-up;
- Preparation and submission of the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) as per guidelines and parameters of NAAC.

The membership of such nominated members shall be for a period of two years. The IQAC should meet at least once in every quarter. The quorum for the meeting shall be two-third of the total number of members. The agenda, minutes and action taken reports are to be documented with official signatures and maintained electronically in a retrievable format.

## University Industry Interaction Cell

- ii. to forge durable alliances with different industrial organizations on knowledge sharing, capacity building and research needs.
- iii. to engage various schools of IIHMR University in research projects, writing research projects, organizing workshops, case studies, management development programmes, conferences, consultancies that are industry specific and helping the schools to connect with the Industry.
- iv. to interact with the industry and their associates to explore the possibility of application of research and knowledge created by the University in the industry.
- v. to enter into collaborations with universities, corporate hospitals, national and international NGOs, pharmaceutical companies, governments for furtherance and the sharing of the core strengths of the University.
- vi. to fine-tune the process of designing Academic curricula, training programmes and research projects to conform to the changing needs of the industry while ensuring representation of the Industry in various forums; to equip students with all necessary skills required by the job market and facilitating students for placements.

### Terms of Reference of the Committee:

## Centres of Excellence

IIHMR University has been engaged in policy issues, planning and management, research and capacity building, mainly in the health sector for over three decades. It has defined health management education and has substantially contributed to research and training. Its education, research and training programmes focus more on health and hospital management, population and reproductive health and evaluation, health economics and finance, human resource, pharmaceutical management, rural management and primary healthcare. In light of its rich experience in health sector, and the felt need for commencing focused studies on various thrust areas, IIHMR University has established dedicated Centres at the University.

### Centre for Injury Research (CIR)

Globally, injuries are emerging as one of the leading causes of loss of lives and physical infirmities constituting over 20 percent of human deaths and disabilities occurring each year. In India, about 12% of deaths and disabilities in a year are caused by injuries. Rapid economic development resulting in urbanization, industrialization, and climate change significantly led to a steep rise in injuries caused by accidents, natural calamities, communal and domestic violence. In the early years, the term “Injury” was synonymous with injury from vehicular accidents, but now the scope of injury is wholly inclusive. It is being considered as an essential public health issue to be addressed on priority.

India has registered an alarming increase in hospitalization of injury inflicted patients. As the occurrences of sustained injuries to human lives are sudden, random, and uncontrollable, there has been less attention to evaluating the causes, intensity, magnitude, and consequences of injuries. This has been noticed that scientific knowledge and analysis possibly help a great deal in permeating awareness about the potential injuries which can prevent and control the injury occurrences. If systematic research is conducted on various aspects and nature of injuries, appropriate remedial measures can be taken well in time. Keeping this fact in mind, a Centre for Injury Research (CIR) has been established in IIHMR University in collaboration with Johns Hopkins International Injury Research Unit at Bloomberg School of Public Health, JHU, and Baltimore, USA, with the mandate to:

- Redefine injury as an urgent public health issue and to promote it as a scientific discipline through quality research, education, and advocacy.
- Conduct studies and implement projects relating to injuries, identification, understanding, patterns, risk factors, prevention opportunities, treatment options etc.
- Collaborate with the governments, non-governmental and business organizations, and stakeholders to document the incidence and impact of injury, understand its causes, identify effective interventions, and promote disseminating of information and policies.
- Build capacity of researchers, health professionals, policymakers, stakeholders, and field officers/ staff involved in injury control and prevention.

- Influence Government policies, systems and legislation for effective prevention and control of injuries through evidence-based research and dissemination of information.
- Spread awareness and facilitate dialogue among public health practitioners, policymakers, researchers, and the general public about the importance of injury prevention and research.

The Centre is striving to bring synergy and convergence through coordination in various disciplines, organizations and arms of the Government like epidemiology and biostatistics; social and behavioral sciences; law and criminal justice; police and transport; disaster relief, engineering and design; health services research; health and public policy; health education and communication; economics; and nursing and medicine.

## **Centre for Health Systems and Policy Research (CHSPR)**

The Centre for Health Systems and Policy Research (CHSPR) aims to bring together two key domains of 'health policy' and 'health systems' which have hitherto tended to operate in silos. In broad terms, the research carried out at the centre seeks to generate new knowledge on how different actors engage and interact in different socio-political milieus to contribute to health policy processes, and how that relates to the public and community health outcomes. The CHSPR is engaged in cutting-edge research and policy advocacy on a wide range of issues about health systems across the South and South-East Asia Region. These include issues such as politics and policies on health financing, health system management and governance, etc.

More specific objectives of the CHSPR are:

- Undertake health policy and systems research in the countries of Southeast Asian Region
- Develop a critical mass of competent researchers in the field of health, hospital, and other related areas
- Generate knowledge and disseminate evidence on effectiveness of health policy and programme interventions and components of health systems, and inform the public policies on health
- IIHMR University has a long-standing collaboration with the Bloomberg School of Public Health of John Hopkins University, the World Health Organization, and several United Nations agencies. The CHSPR is open to partnership with other leading institutes.

## **Centre for Gender Studies (CGS)**

The Centre for Gender Studies (CGS) is an interdisciplinary forum for integrating gender at the University. The Centre aims at undertaking academic, research and capacity building activities on gender and related issues. The Centre is instrumental in promoting awareness among the staff and students. The Centre is expected to offer disciplinary and interdisciplinary academic programmes in Gender studies; provide technical and institutional support for gender mainstreaming in planning, impending, monitoring, and evaluation of programmes; generate evidence based quality research on various aspects of gender which can influence policy formulation, budgetary allocations, public opinion and awareness; to work as a vibrant forum for building capacities of persons who are involved in implementation and formulations of the policies/programmes related to gender and equality. It will help the educators, policymakers as well as

other key stakeholders in gender-transformative planning and designing service delivery system; organize lectures, seminars, workshops and film screenings on a wide range of subjects related to gender and equality; promote community engagement; document and disseminate the perspectives and experience of studies and research conducted under the Centre. The Centre implement Gender Champion Scheme as suggested by UGC.

## **Centre for Health Economics (CHE)**

The Centre for Health Economics was engaged in capacity building on Vaccine Economics for COVID-19 during October 17- December 13, 2020. COVID-19 has dramatically altered vaccine decision making. There are new challenges in how to maintain routine vaccine coverage and coming challenges in rapid deployment of the COVID-19 vaccine. The Online Course on Vaccine Economics for COVID-19 was jointly organized by John Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health and IIHMR University for vaccine policy makers and programme managers by Dr. P. R Sodani, as Programme Coordinator. The purpose of the capacity building programme was enhancing the competency of programme managers and policy makers in using the economics tools such as estimating demand for vaccine, estimating cost of vaccine programme, etc. to optimize vaccine coverage during the challenges of COVID-19.

During the online capacity building programme, two online Regional Workshops on The Role of Demand for Vaccines and Incremental Costs of Routine Immunization, Campaigns, and Outreach Services were organized to discuss the intricacies pertaining to the factors determining demand for vaccines and costing of vaccine programmes.

A total of 54 participants enrolled in the online capacity building programme and out of 54 participants, 23 were able to complete the course successfully. The programme participants included mid/senior professionals working as Director, Deputy Director, Consultant, Technical Advisor, Medical officer, Project Coordinator, and Programme Manager in the field of immunization and vaccine delivery. The participants were from Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, State Governments, WHO, UNDP, UNICEF, Tata Trust, Clinton Health Access Initiative and IIT Kharagpur.

The Centre for Health Economics conducted five such capacity building training workshops during 2017-18 and 2018-19. During these programmes 85 programme managers and policy makers from Bangladesh, Ghana, India Malaysia, Myanmar, Sierra Leone and Sri Lanka have been benefitted.

## **Centre for Mindfulness, Wellness, and Ethics (CMWE)**

The Centre for Mindfulness, Wellness, and Ethics (CMWE) aims to promote holistic health and wellness by combining the theory and practices in this interdisciplinary field. At CMWE, an integrated approach of linking the ethical behaviour to different wellness dimensions including physical, psychological, social, spiritual and economic is followed. The focus is on relevance and wisdom while contextually aligning the methodology for driving knowledge creation and dissemination related to ethics, mindfulness and spirituality. The centre believes in knowledge generation however, innovation and relevance are the keys. Centre is involved in various activities to promote total wellness. The centre conducts research, training, and academic courses on topics related to ethics and wellness in healthcare context. Aligning to the IIHMR University mission, the Centre plays key role in promoting health and wellness through its activities, and thereby contributing to realization of one's true human potential.

CMWE recognizes that state of happiness and well-being is the essential indicator of good health. We encourage the practice of mindfulness and compassion in everyday life to achieve good health and well-being. The following are the key areas of CMWE activities –

### **Research**

- Undertaking research in areas linked to ethics, spirituality, meditation, performing art and music with emphasis on holistic health and well-being.
- Collaborative research initiatives with government departments, agencies and other organizations.

Each administrative and academic vertical conducted detailed assessments of the enabling and mitigating factors that are likely to shape the coming financial year's budgetary projections. The result is the proposed budget.

The separate budgeting of the Schools has brought more accountability and awareness about the resource generation at the School level. This exercise will strengthen the self-sustaining character of the University.

**1. Method of Accounting**

The method of accounting followed by the University is on accrual system of accounting.

**2. Fixed Assets**

The gross block of fixed assets is shown at the cost of acquisition.

**3. Investments**

Investments are stated at cost. Considering them as long term investment, No Short term deficit / gain has been accounted for.

**4. Depreciation**

Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on written down value method as per rates prescribed in Part-C of Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013 as amended up to date.

**5. Retirement benefits to Employees**

The University liability towards retirement benefits in the form of provident fund, gratuity and leave encashment are charged to expenditure account.

6. The IIHMR university is an approved charitable institution by Commissioner of Income Tax (exemption) u/s 12AA (1)(b) of the Income Tax Act, 1961 vide Provisional Registration Number AAAJI0480NE20214.

7. University's educational courses & programmes activities have been approved u/s 10 (23C) (vi) of Income Tax Act, 1961 by Commissioner of Income Tax (Exemptions), Jaipur vide Unique registration number No AAAJI0480N/08/17-18/O-0008/10(23C)(vi) dated 13/08/2018, w.e.f. assessment year 2018-19.





### **Activities undertaken to abstain the spread of Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) as per the advisory issued by UGC (University Grants Commission) and Higher Education Department of Government of Rajasthan:**

The University has taken the necessary precautions and has followed the advisory issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC) and Higher Education Department of Government of Rajasthan to prevent/reduce of the spread of the Covid-19. Following activities were undertaken:

- Post-lockdown the university started functioning only for the essential academic and non-academic activities with a capacity of only 33% staff and then it was increased to 50%. After which the office was started on rotational basis from May 25, 2020 to June 15, 2020. In the month of July the office

functioned on alternate day/ rotational basis. In the month of August 2020 onwards till date multiple decisions have been taken regarding work from home/ rotation/ shift working as per the ongoing Covid-19 circumstances.

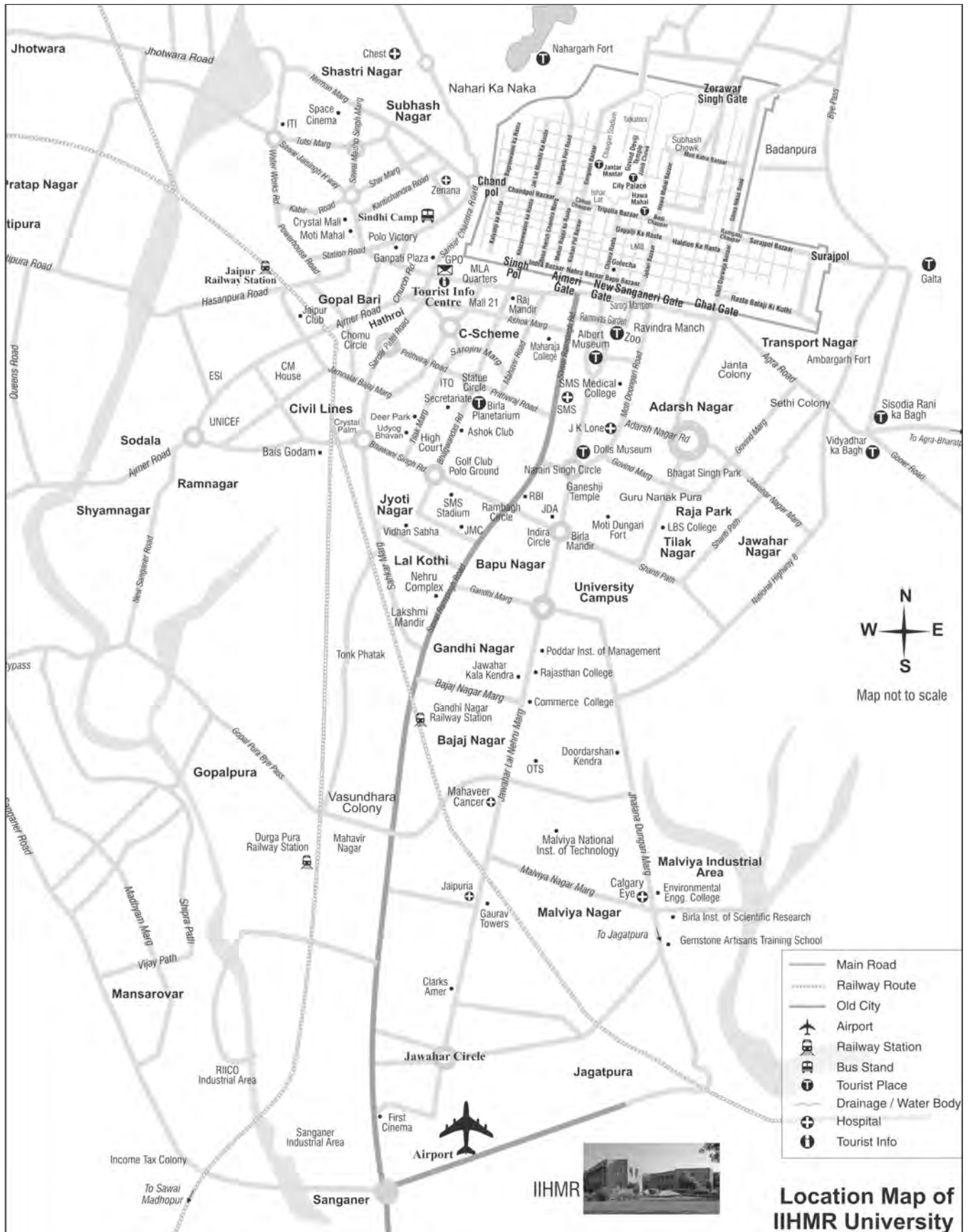
- During the above period all the employees who were above the age of 60 years, were given flexibility of working from home or coming office on alternate day/ half day. The University focused more on delivery of productivity rather than physical presence in the premises.
- Arrangements of fumigation and sanitization were made. Kits consisting of sanitizer, gloves, face masks, toothpicks were distributed.
- As a precautionary measure, self-declaration forms from all the employees were filled for their co-morbidity, outstation travel, cold/ fever symptoms etc.
- If any employee was found with any symptoms of flu or has travelled out of station, he/ she was provided work from home facility or was quarantined for 14 days.
- During the last one year all employees and contractors have been treated empathetically through support in working from home and payment of full salary without any deduction.
- A SOP was developed in consultation with all stakeholders of university for ensuring that all norms are followed & the best practices are put in place for smooth functioning.
- As per SOP, a team from the administration has been regularly fumigating and sanitizing the entire campus on a regular periodicity to control spread of the virus.
- For ensuring social distancing, seating arrangements of employees were temporarily changed.
- A medical doctor working at a renowned hospital was hired as a consultant to support all medical requirements of students and employees. With the re-opening of the hostel, a certified full-time nurse was hired to ensure that all medical requirements are fulfilled across the day.
- Six rooms in the hostel were identified and prepared as a temporary quarantine facility with all required apparatus including an oxygen cylinder.
- Packaged food was delivered to every student at their hostel rooms and to the employees living in the guest houses.
- While couple of students were tested positive for Covid-19, they were shifted to a dedicated building on campus and supported through medical staff up to their recovery.

## Conclusion
