# 1. About the University

## Origin

The genesis of the IIHMR University, Jaipur dates back to October 05, 1984, when its sponsoring body, the Indian Institute of Health Management Research (IIHMR) was established and registered as a non-profit Society under the Rajasthan Societies Registration Act, 1958. IIHMR University, Jaipur, has been established and incorporated as a postgraduate research University by the Government of Rajasthan vide the IIHMR University Ordinance, 2013 (Ordinance No. 30 of 2013) promulgated on September 27, 2013, by the Governor, which was replaced by the IIHMR University, Jaipur Act, 2014 (Act No. 3 of 2014) passed by the State Legislature on February 07, 2014. The IIHMR University, Jaipur Act, 2014 (Act No. 3 of 2014) received the assent of the Governor on February 25, 2014, and was notified in the Rajasthan Gazette Extraordinary on February 26, 2014. It has been deemed to have come into force on and from September 27, 2013.

## Objectives of the University

As defined in Section 4 of the IIHMR University, Jaipur Act, 2014, the objects of the University shall be to undertake only postgraduate education and research in the disciplines specified in Schedule II and such other disciplines as the University may with prior approval of the State Government, determine from time to time and to achieve excellence and impart and disseminate knowledge in the said disciplines. 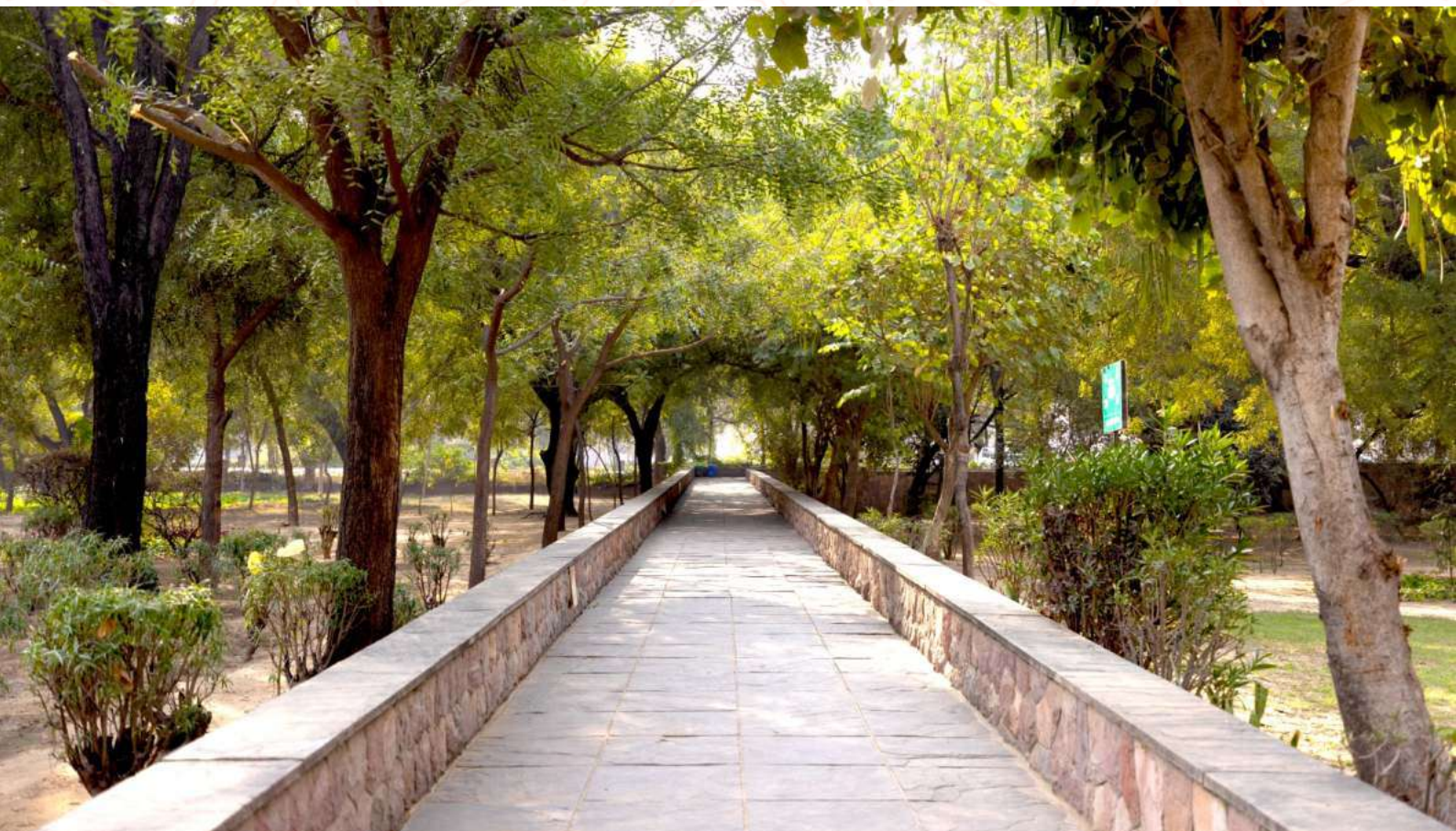

**MBA (Pharmaceutical Management):** A two-year full-time programme offered by IIHMR University under the School of Pharmaceutical Management. The total number of students admitted in the academic session 2022-24 was 107 (34 Female; 73 Male). The programme aims to develop professional leaders and managers with requisite competencies and skills in solving managerial problems in the pharmaceutical industry.

**MBA (Development Management):** A two-year full-time programme offered by IIHMR University under the School of Development Studies. The total number of students admitted in the academic session 2022-24 was 16 (7 Female; 9 Male). The programme aims to develop professional leaders and managers with requisite competencies and skills in solving managerial problems of the development sector.

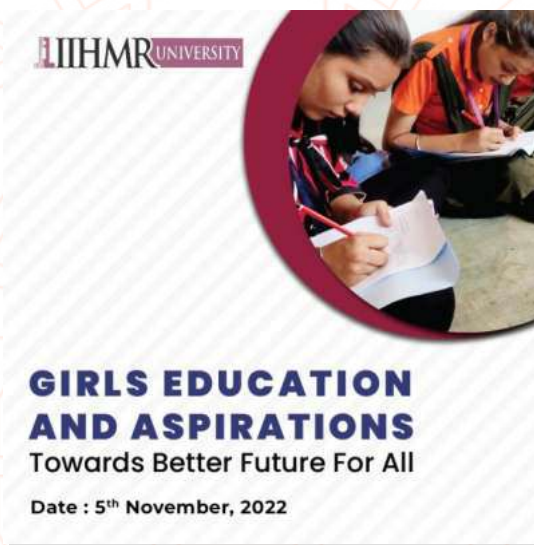
## Workshop on Implementation Research, September 21-23, 2022

# 14. Financial Systems

The University is a self-financed organization and does not receive any grant or other financial assistance from the State Government.

## Accounting and Financial Procedures

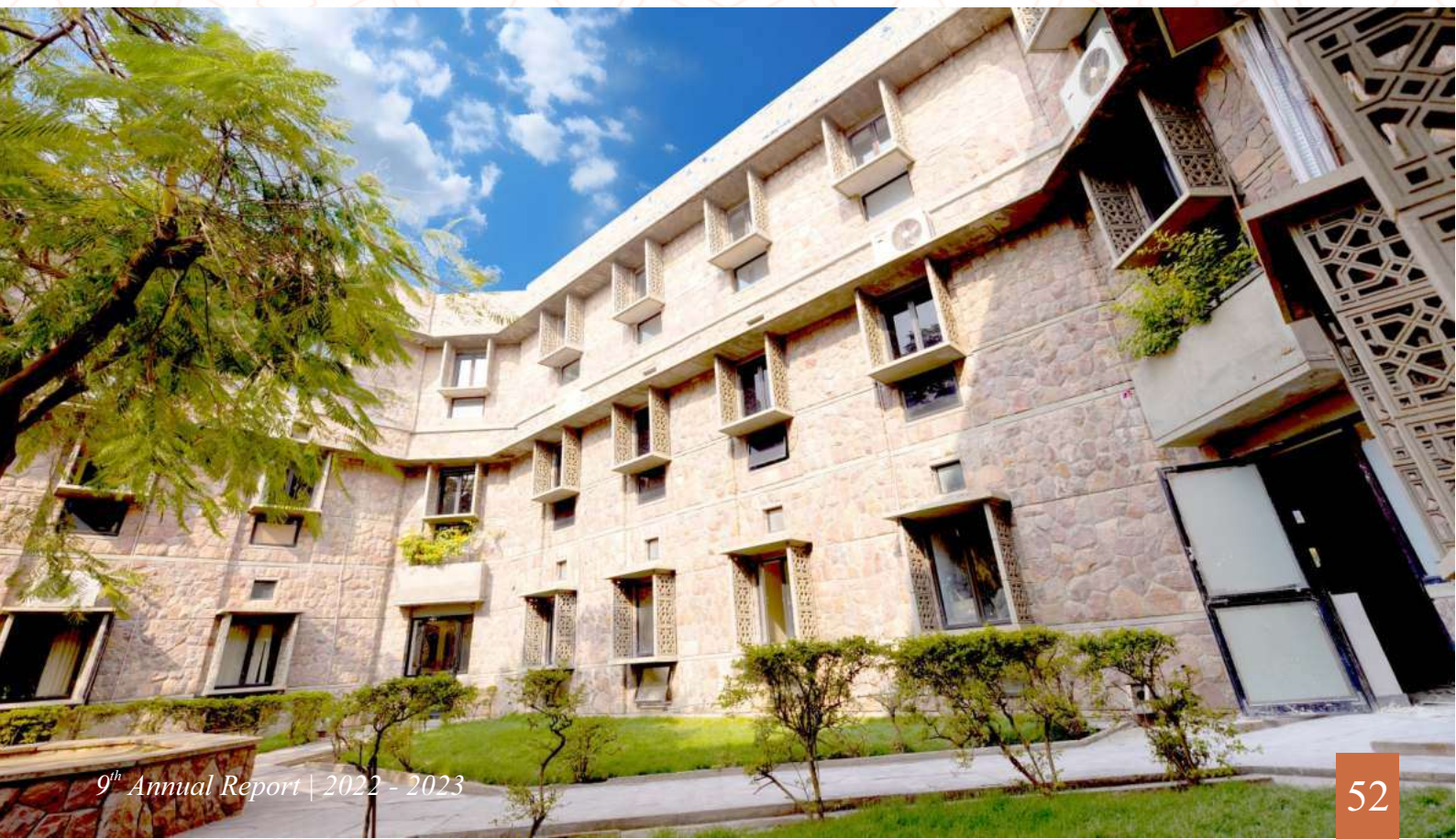
IIHMR University has approved Accounting and Financial Procedures, and all activities and tasks of the Finance and Accounts Department are performed in accordance with the Accounting and Financial Procedures. There are adequate checks and balances to insulate the organization from misappropriation and misuse of financial resources. The accounting procedures adequately provide efficient management of university funds and assets. The procedures also manifestly depict the responsibilities of persons managing the finance and budget. The Finance and Accounts Department adheres to the university's accounting procedures.

## Annual Budgeting

The University prepares its Annual Budget every year. For the Financial Year 2022-2023, the Annual Budget has been prepared based on a participatory process involving the Registrar, Deans, Faculty Members, and Heads of Department (Administration, Finance, IT, Library, etc.). Each administrative and academic vertical conducted detailed assessments of the enabling and mitigating factors that are likely to shape the coming financial year's budgetary projections. The result is the proposed budget. The separate budgeting of the schools has brought more accountability and awareness about the resource generation at the school-level. This exercise will strengthen the self-sustaining character of the University.

**Schedule 'B' of Significant Accounting Policies and Notes forming part of Accounts for the year ending 31/03/2023**

1. **Method of Accounting**

The method of accounting followed by the University is on accrual system of accounting.

2. **Fixed Assets**

The gross block of fixed assets is shown at the cost of acquisition.

3. **Investments**

Investments are stated at purchase cost. Considering them as long-term investment, no short-term fluctuating deficit/gain has been accounted for.

4. **Depreciation**

Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on written down value method as per rates prescribed in Part-C of Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013 as amended up to date.

5. **Retirement Benefits to Employees**

The University's liability towards retirement benefits in the form of provident fund, gratuity and leave encashment is charged to the expenditure account.

6. The IIHMR University is an approved charitable institution by the Commissioner of Income Tax (exemption) u/s 12AA (1)(b) of the Income Tax Act, 1961 vide Provisional Registration Number AAAJ10480NE20214 dated 31/05/2021 up to A.Y. 2026-27.

7. Term loan, Overdraft limit and Bank Guarantee limit from Kotak Mahindra Bank Ltd is secured against the first and exclusive charge by way of equitable mortgage of immovable property being Land and Building situated at 1, Prabhu Dayal Marg, Sanganer Airport, 302029 and all existing and future receivables/current assets, movable assets of the IIHMR University.

8. Unsecured Loan from Indian Institute of Health Management Research bearing an interest amount of Rs. 3.10 Crore is repayable on demand.

**9. Contingent Liabilities:**

- a. Local taxes (UDT) amounting to Rs. 79,37,174/- (without penalty) due till date is being contested and the matter is subjudice. We are hopeful to get the matter settled in our favor.
- b. IIHMR has applied for a grant of exemption u/s 17(1) of the EPF & Misc. Provisions Act, 1952, in the year 2009, which is still pending. An inquiry u/s 7-A of the EPF & Misc. Provisions Act, 1952 is initiated against IIHMR and a provisional liability of Rs. 11,26,15,480/- ascertained and demanded on IIHMR, out of which Rs 6,86,11,107/- pertains to old employees of IIHMR who were transferred to IIHMR University, Jaipur. IIHMR is contesting the matter with the competent authority, and they are hopeful of settling the matter in their favour. As such, no liability will fall on IIHMR University.
