The IIHMR University, Jaipur, has been ranked first amongst the cleanest higher educational institutions in India in the non-residential universities category in the Swachh Campus Rankings 2019 of Higher Education Institutions organized by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Govt. of India.

Mr. R. Subrahmanyam, Secretary, Dept. of Higher Education, MHRD, presented the award to Dr Pankaj Gupta, President, IIHMR University. IIHMR University emerged as No. 1 university in the non-residential category.

October 18, 2019: India child stunting rate is 37.9%, which is categorized as very high in terms of its public health significance. Rajasthan has 39.1% of children (under-5 years), who have stunted growth. shows that disturbing trend on malnutrition in India. It is a high time we should take steps to address this issue. We must take up small steps which will give us direction towards future growth. 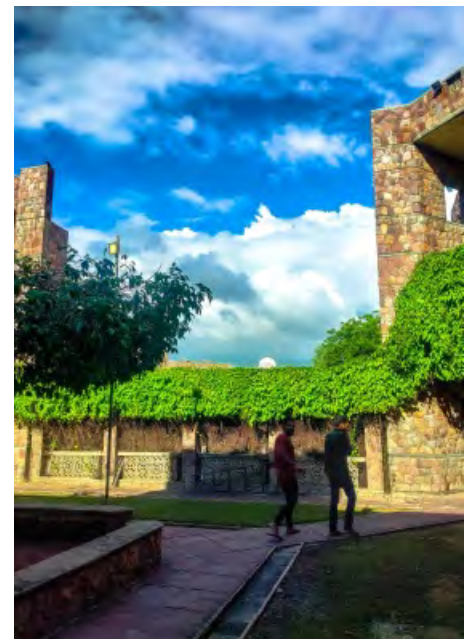
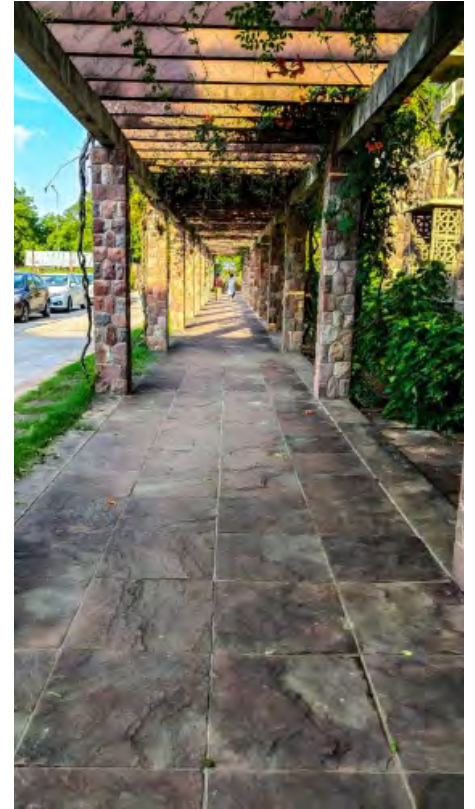
