2. EVENT DETAILS

IIHMR University organised the second batch of the **Two-week International Training Programme on Transformational Leadership for Health System Strengthening (TLHSS)** from June 29 to July 10, 2026, under the Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) Scheme of the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India.

The programme brought together healthcare professionals from nine countries, including Belarus, Bhutan, Fiji, Kenya, Nepal, Sierra Leone, Sri Lanka, Tajikistan, and Tanzania. The international composition of the cohort provided participants with an opportunity to exchange experiences, understand diverse health-system contexts, and develop professional networks for future collaboration.

The programme was inaugurated by Dr. P. R. Sodani, President, IIHMR University, Jaipur. In his address, Dr. Sodani emphasised the importance of global partnerships, knowledge exchange, and visionary leadership in advancing resilient and sustainable health systems.

The training adopted a multidisciplinary approach and included focused sessions on health systems, health economics, healthcare analytics, Artificial Intelligence, implementation science, and transformational leadership. The programme was designed to strengthen participants' leadership competencies and support the application of evidence-informed approaches to health-system planning, management, and transformation.

The academic sessions enabled participants to explore contemporary challenges in healthcare delivery and examine the role of leadership, innovation, technology, research, and implementation science in improving health-system performance. The programme also encouraged cross-country learning and the sharing of practical experiences from different national and institutional settings.

Overall, the Two-week International Training Programme strengthened professional competencies, promoted international academic engagement, and supported the development of future leaders capable of contributing to resilient, sustainable, and evidence-informed health systems.
